

### Farmers burn unsold jute in Netrakona

SYDNEY, Aug 17: A gunman armed with an AK-47 automatic rifle and a machete went berserk in a crowded shopping plaza Saturday, killing at least seven people and wounding several others before shooting himself to death. The sniper opened fire from an upper level car park at the westend Stathsield Plaza shopping centre, which was crowded with mid-asternoon shoppers.
