Second Friendship bridge opens

PM's call to identify proper development perspective

MYMENSINGH, Aug 18: Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia today called upon all patriotic forces to identify current development perspective to salvage country's ruined economy, reports UNB.

Begum Zia said this while inaugurating the second Bangladesh-China Friendship Bridge at Shambhuganj in Mymensingh on Sunday.

The bridge over the Old Brahmaputra has been constructed at a cost of Tk 78 crore, including Tk 44 crore provided by China. The construction work on the 463.80meter long and 14.40-metre wide bridge started in December 1989 and completed five months ahead of schedule.

According to local people, the commissioning of the bridge would make easier the communication of Kishoreganj, Netrakona and Sherpur districts with Mymensingh town

and Dhaka. The first Bangladesh-China Friendship Bridge was constructed over river Buriganga Work on the third Bangladesh-China Friendship Bridge over the Mahananda in Chapainawabganj is expected to begin by the end of this year.

Chinese special envoy

Madame Chen Muhua attended the opening ceremony and

spoke on the occasion. Communication Minister Oli Ahmed, LGRD and Cooperatives Minister Abdus Salam Talukder, AKM Fazlul Hug, MP, Nazem Ahmed Chowdhury, Secretary, Road and Road Transport Division and Ataur Rahman also addressed the function.

Begum Zia underlined the significance of road communication infrastructure for the socio-economic development of a country and said her government was attaching importance to communication system in the national development programmes.

She hoped bringing all upazilas of the country under a greater road communication network would be possible within next few years.

Begum Zia said Shaheed President Ziaur Rahman had taken up steps for laying a strong economic base for improving the lot of the downtrodden. But the autocratic regime had destroyed its base, she said, adding overall economy had been crippled due to indiscipline, irregularities and nepotism entrenched in different tiers.

College lecturers New SSC exam system dropped

The pass mark for each paper in the Secondary School Certificate (SSC) examinations will be 33 calculated in a combined way, not separately for objective and narrative parts.

Education Minister Prof Badruddoza Chowdhury said on Sunday the government had accepted the three-point demand of the agitating school students and there would be no objective questions in mathematics, both compulsory and elective papers.

Addressing a news conference at the National Academy for Educational Management he clarified that first and second division marks would remain unchanged - 600 and 450 respectively.

The Education Minister said the government had accepted the demands in the interest of peace and discipline and called upon students to go back to their schools.

Students of schools of Dhaka city were agitating since August 14 to press home their demands that the pass mark for each paper should be 33, not 36 (20 for narrative and 16 for objective questions), that pass marks should be determined as a whole not separately, and that there should be no objective part in question papers of mathematics. both compulsory and elective

During the past three days, students in some areas of the city went violent disrupting road traffic and damaging a large number of vehicles.

Chowdhury said the newly introduced system was a progressive one and it was being followed by many other countries including our neighbours.

The government had taken decision in December 1988 to introduce the system. He said under this system, 50 per cent of the questions will be narrative and 50 per cent objective. The government had also decided that the examinees would have to pass narrative and objective portions separately. The pass mark in the objective portion was 20. In the narrative portion the pass mark was 16.

The Education Minister said the new examination system was introduced from 1989 in class eight as a preparation See Page 12 Col. 1

When the officer in charge of the thana went to the spot at 6 a. m. Sunday along with a police force after receiving the report they were intercepted by the local people. Recovered property, cash incompatible with Ershad's sources of income: AG

Attorney General Aminul Haque said on Sunday that the property and cash totalling Taka 2.20 crore found in deposed President Ershad's possession was incompatible with his known sources of income.

The prosecution in Ershad's wealth amassing case in the Special Judge Court yesterday gave an account of the total income of the accused since 1952 when he joined service.

Attorney General Aminul Haque said that Ershad's total income from all known sources was Taka 73,21,527 including his salary and other benefits from his job amounting to Taka 25, 63, 947. His income also included house rent received from his two houses in Rangpur and his paternal property.

On the other hand the total value of his assets, property and cash in hand has been calculated at Taka 2,94,86,765. In the Court of Special Judge Mohammad Ali Khan

Iran wants pressure on Israel for Palestinian hostages'release

Hartal call in TEHRAN, Aug 18: Israel must be pressured to free Palestinian and Lebanese captives, but there is a positive trend in efforts to resolve the hostages-prisoner issue. Iranian Foreign Minister Ali Akbar Velayati said today, report agencies.

Velayati, who was speaking to members of the European Parliament, said, "Something positive is happening for the settlement of this affair and now Israel must be put under pressure to free Lebanese and

Palestinian hostages." Velayati, quoted by Tehran Radio, said he hoped that U N Secretary General Javier perez de Cuellar's involvement in the issue attains "positive results."
