With the Assistance of UNICEF the project is being implemented in Comilla, Chittagong, Noakhali, Brahmanbaria and Sylhet pourashavas The meeting was attended by the Chairmen of pourashava's, Executive Engineers of LGEB, Assistant Engineers of pourashava's and community organizers of Slum Improvement Project. It was chaired by Mr. J.R. Chowdhury, Project Director of SIP while Mr. A.T. Siddique, Zone Officer of UNICEF, Comilla were the chief guest and special guest respectively.

About 5000 families from 37 slums are being covered under this project. The main objectives of this project are to bring down the infant mortality rate, improvement of sanitary conditions, supply of pure drinking water, train mothers regarding nutrition, personal hygiene and income generating loans.

In Comilla 592 families of four slums have been taken under this project. From January '91 to June this year 50 latrines, 36 tubewells, 648 metre drains, 521 footpaths have been installed and constructed. About Taka 1,87,000 has been distributed as interest free loan (15 per cent service charge) and the period of recovery was 48 weeks. The amount of service charge was also deposited in the welfare fund. A total of 6,77,406 Taka has been spent during the last six months in Comilla.
