A meeting of the IAAF's 23member council decided on Sunday that South Africa, expelled from the Federation in 1976 because of its apartheid policies, had not met all the conditions for re-entry.

"It has been noted that at the moment, despite all the efforts taken, there is no unity in South African athletics." IAAF council member Istvan

Dalmiya said. "Pakistan had no reservations about reviving last year's aborted tour of India but wanted to include two Tests in the short tour", Dalmiya said.

Last year's planned tour by Pakistan had to be postponed because of Hindu-Muslim violence in India.

"They (Pakistan) have consented to play the limited-over series immediately after the champions Trophy in Sharjah, Dalmiya said.

India is yet to finalise the itinerary for the tour which begins on October 26.
