MUNISHIGANJ, Aug 20: The fifty-bed Munshiganj Sadar Hospital is beset with problems like lack of blood bank, shortage of medicines, absence of ENT specialist and lack of X-ray facilities. Moreover, the campus area plunges into darkness after dusk and the overall unhygienic condition prevailing in and around the hospital has aggravated the situation.

The shortage of medicines and apparatus, absence of X-ray machine and the overall poor maintenance system have made the patients more sick. The fifty-bed district
