UNDP report on sanitation strategy submitted to PM

United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) has submitted a report on "Water-Supply and Sanitation Sector in Bangladesh - Proposal for Future Strategies" to Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia, reports UNB.

The UNDP Acting Resident Representative in Bangladesh Winston Temple presented a copy of the report to the Prime Minister on Tuesday.

The objective of the study was to review the experience of Bangladesh during the International Drinking Water Supply and Sanitation Decade (1980-90), to identify the areas of weaknesses and constraint and to suggest future strategies.

The Prime Minister was impressed by the undertakings of UNDP and its services provided to the development of various sectors of the country

particularly in water supply and sanitation.

She expressed her hope for the improvement of the sector both rural and urban which will eventually lead to the reduction of diarrhoeal morbidity and mortality.

Emphasing the importance of women and NGOs in sanitation development she urged UNDP to continue its assistance in the country's development efforts.

The report has been prepared by a group of national consultants funded by UNDP. in collaboration with the government and key donor agencles active in this sector.

UNDP in collaboration with the government is expected to hold a National Seminar in September this year to obtain a general consensus on the report findings.

Meanwhile, the dissident BNP leaders announced fresh programmes in support of their demand. They will launch siege by putting barricade over Dhaka-Chittagong highway at Pahartali point in a bid to stop all communication between Chittagong and other districts. They also gave a call for full day hartal at Chittagong-8 constituency on Saturday. Three leaders from Chittagong BNP submitted nomination papers. They are Amir Khasru Mahmud Chowdhury, Zahiruddin Khan and Ekramul Karim.

New pay scales for govt employees

The government Tuesday announced a new national pay scale for officers and employees of government, semi-government and autonomous organisations, reports BSS.

According to a Press Note issued late night the decision to give this new enhanced pay scale has been taken after sympathetic and sincere consideration of the low paid emp ployees and present market price.

The Press Note said the new pay scale will come into effeet from July 1, 1991. However, the allowances will come into effect from June 1, 1992, the Press Note said adding that at present they will get the allowances on old rates.

The Press Note said the present government had inherited a ruined economy caused by the undue interference, breaking rules and procedures and corruption at higher level in the economic sector during the last nine years of autocratic rule. But despite immense resource constraint the present government elected by the people has decided to give enhanced pay scale taking into account the condition of the low patd employees. The lowest basic pay in the new national pay scale has been fixed at Taka 900 the Press Note said adding in this scale the employees will get Taka 1605 in the initial stage. The Press Note mentioned that in the last pay scale they used to get Taka 1,110.

The Press Note pointed out the government had to spend an additional amount of Taka 400 crore annually to give effect the new pay scale.

The government will in addition require more Taka 550 crore to give new rates of allowances on June 1 next year un-

der new pay scale. The economy had to be strengthened to give a deep root and consolidate the democratic system achieved after nine years. This objective can not be achieved without extra work

and labour, the Press Note added. The Press Note said the government would also constitute a committee to examine the cases of promotion of the employee and give recommendation in this regard.

Establishment Ministry will take necessary steps in this connection.
