Saline water likely to damage crop lands

BARISAL, Aug 24: Crops on more than one lakh acres of land in Bhola district are feared to be damaged by the intrusion of saline water in the absence of necessary repair of 17 km long damaged coastal embankment, reports UNB.

The embankment was damaged by the last devastating cyclone and tidal surge.

Water Development Board had taken up a Food for Works Programme with 1000 metric tons of wheat and allotted Tk 20 lakh for necessary repair works. But after the partial repair of the embankment, the works have been stopped due to shortage of allocation of wheat and cash money.

The crops on vast areas of land in seven upazilas of Bhola district along the damaged embankment may be inundated at any time during this season by the intrusion of saline water.
