A well-placed Jordanian source told Reuter that Arafat was maintaining his tough line on the conference and wanted pledges from the US which Washington would be unlikely to provide.

PATTAYA (Thatland), Aug 26: Cambodians opened peace talks today with an end to their long war within reach but voicing fears that the United States might play a spoiler's role. The new Soviet Defence Minister said on Sunday that 80 per cent of the high command would be replaced - the biggest change since Stalinist military purges in 1937.

On that occasion, the officers were shot after show trials. Gorbachev insist he wants no repetition of those times.

The President ordered KGB troops, seen by Yeltsin as the major threat during the threeday coup, transferred to the control of the Interior Minister. He also sacked the commander of the KGB's "Alpha" anti-terrorist unit who had ordered his troops to storm the Russian Parliament.
