Anti-smuggling drive

CHAPAINAWABGANJ, Aug 28 : Business activities in the district have declined due to anti-smuggling drives launched by BDR and task force, according to informed sources.

Transactions at hats, bazars and banks and other business establishments of the district were very poor during the last six months.

Before the anti-smuggling drives began the daily transactions were Taka six crore in several commercial banks of the district. But since the antismuggling drives have been launched the transactions have remarkably declined during the period. BDR sources said that the

drives automatically put restriction on illegal money flow in the markets which affected all aspects of economic and social activities. They said that crackdown on smuggling and smugglers would continue despite pressure from a section of unscrupulous businessmen.
