He said that more than 20,000 Bangladeshis had already been employed in Kuwait after it was freed from Iraqi occupation. About 70,000 Bangladesht workers had to be evacuated from the oil-rich Emirate following the Iraqi invasion 13 months back.

Kuwaiti authorities have already indicated that they would take back all Bangladeshis who lost their jobs in the Emirate after the Iraqi aggression, the Minister said.

Besides, he said, they are reported to have offered to employ about 20,000 Bangladeshi women in hospitals, clinics, schools and garment factories.





Mira Karim learnt printmaking while watching the workers as a senior programme officer for BRAC for five years. Her task was to. supervise programme designing and staff work. She dealt with destitute women who were involved in income generating products. Their outlet were places like "Aarong". She gathered ample knowledge of marketing research, while

Mira comes from a family where individuals have gone in for creative work. Her father was an engineer. Her sister Nasreen designs dolls for "Aarong" and other centres. Another sister has the "Joya" boutique at "Sheraton." Her two brothers are artists - one having gone in for film and publication while the other is in advertising. A sister-in-law is in the BSIC design

they themselves, in turn, sell as finished products. She finds it too much of a hassle to compete with shops or even have contact with shopkeepers in New Market, Gousia and Hawker's Market. She also finds it 'below her dignity' to sit and bargain with shop-owners. Her customers are her acquaintances from places like

Sunbeams and Scholastica school, or the Jahangirnagar University teachers. "It hurts my pride to go looking for work. This way I have sufficient work to take up my spare time and I enjoy dealing with my customers." The one hour that I was with Mira I found her inundated with customers with their various de-Mira, who has taken tips from the Vegetable

Dye Centre in Dhanmandt, does the design layout herself. Her family members then draw it out for her. It is she who decides whether she wants in the form of flowers, or paisley or elephant or peacock motifs and they fit in the patterns. This is in the case of items like bedsheets or new patterns for "saris".

She has, otherwise, catalogue books where the customers can choose the pattern. A "kamtz"-set is usually for Tk 100 while a minor print work maybe only Tk 50. A cotton "sari" costs Tk 80 to Tk 120 while the silk costs Tk 150 to Tk 200 for work in the "paar", "anchal" and all over. Women in their twenties and over, come here with their clothes to have them patterned with brightly coloured motifs to give them an individuality. The "shalwarkameez" or the "sart" then looks unusual, with a specially designed and coloured pattern. People do not like to wear materials which many other persons may also be wearing. Women prefer exclusive designs. To get the individual print is rare in the city. By the block-print method, at a low cost, you have

something differ-ent from the othe-rs and a design to suit your persona-lity, figure and complexion. The blocks alone

has cost her Tk 80,000. In dull season, which is the rainy season, when she cannot dry her products, the income is limited to Tk 3,000 a month. During Eld this may shoot up to Tk 10,000. At that time she employs two more hands. "Mind you, I don't count any remuneration of my own. I still get job. offers and independently get a good salary. But due to my family I must suffice with my hankering for block printing. Whatever gain in my work invest it back into my project," she tells

places like the "Bichitra" and "Jogajogbarta" competition. Her "shalwar-kameez" pattern too has won a prize as well. If, by any chance, the material is ruined, she replaces it. On a rainy day she might be

able to print only one "sart" instead of the usual three or five. Talking to Tajul Islam, 28, the main worker, found that he had been doing block print work in Mirpur for 12 years with the Biharis. "Now they have all left and gone to India or elsewhere. I then worked in Islampur for two

years. I've been in this profession for 16 years

and I thoroughly enjoy it. I prefer working on 'saris' than on 'shalwar-kameez' as that is easier and less time consuming," he said. Hazrat Ali 21, the other hand, worked before as a vendor of vegetables and fruit. He comes originally from Mymensingh. As he has a family, he does not sleep on the premises like Tajul, and brings his own lunch. He gets much less than Tajul but is contented with his work,
