
### MMC to reopen on Sept 17

But despite declarations of sovereignty and independence passed by parliaments in each of the three republics, their drive for independence had made little concrete progress prior to the coup d'etat of August 19-21.

The government of Lithuania, followed by Latvia and Estonia proclaimed their independence again as the coup failed and ordered Soviet troops to withdraw from their territory.

"Today is very important day to the new status of our state," said Lithuanian Vytautas President Landsbergis, who read of the decision on the Tass news

The fact that this discussion has been made is a very joyful and positive act in all aspects not only to Lithuania Latvia and Estonia, but also to the Soviet Union itself and the whole world, Landsbergis told reporters in Vilnius.

The attendance of Estonian Prime Minister Edgar Savisaar at the State Council session was a surprise. It was not clear whether he voted or merely was an observer.

Earlier Friday, Gorbachev and Yeltsin declared in a joint television appearance that more than 70 years of Communist rule was a failure.

"This experiment which was conducted on our soil was a tragedy for our people and it was too bad that it happened on our territory," Yeltsin said.

Anatoly Lukyanov was charged Thursday, one day after he was formally fired by the Congress of People's Deputies, Russian prosecutor Valentin Stepankov told re-

### Guatemala recognises Belize

GUATEMALA CITY (Guatemala), Sept 6: Guatemala officially recognised on Thursday the independence of neighbouring Belize but officials said it had not dropped its territorial claim to part of the former British colony. A Guatemalan government statement referred to "the independent state of Belize" while calling for renewed negotiations over its centuries-old dispute with the Caribbean nation that gained independence from Britain in 1981, reports Reuter.

### 'Via Baltica' reopened

HELSINKI, Sept 6: A highway route, blocked for decades, has apparently reopened through the Baltic republics to Warsaw and other European cities. The "Via Baltica" overland route became a reality again when Lithuania told Finland its border with Poland has been opened, reports Reuter.

### Worst flood across Indo-China

BANGKOK, Sept 6: The worst flooding in decades continues to devastate Southeast Asia, destroying entire towns and inundating vast areas, according to news reports Friday. At least 30 people were reported missing, and reports described widespread crop damage, reports AP.

### Cuba rations cooking fuel

MEXICO CITY, Sept 6: Cuba, already reeling from deep cuts in Soviet aid, is switching from fertilizer to compost and plans to ration yet another basic staple - cooking oil as Moscow indicates further aid reductions are ahead. In yet another blow to Fidel Castro, Russian President Boris Yeltsin said Friday he believed Soviet troops would be gradually removed from Cuba. Soviet President Mikhail Gorbachev said ties with Cuba should be changed in a way to aid both countries, reports AP.

### Baker to talk US aid to Baltic states

WASHINGTON, Sept 6: Secretary of State James A Baker will be ready to discuss a wide range of US assistance during his visits to the three newly independent Baltic states next week. This could include direct aid, the State Department implied in a statement issued late Thursday, reports AP.

### 12 hurt in clash over possession of shrimpbed

KHULNA, Sept 6: At least 12 people were injured when miscreants opened fire on the inhabitants of Jabusha village in Rupsha upazila of the district to take possession of a shrimpbed, police said, reports UNB. Three of them who sus-

tained bullet injuries, were admitted to the Sadar Hospital in a critical condition. They were identified Kamrul Islam (20), Raihan Mollah (20) and Gaffar (25) of Jabusha village. The clash erupted when a gang of miscreants numbering

about 25 tried to take possession of the Haria Shrimpbed cultivated by the villagers on a cooperative basis. They opened fire on the villagers who unitedly tried to resist the miscreants.

The gang looted shrimps worth about Tk five lakh allegedly at the instance of a lodemanded 25 per cent share of the shrimpbed.
