Freedom Party urges people to cast 'no' vote in referendum

Freedom Party Saturday brought out a procession in the city asking people to cast negative votes in the September 15 referendum, reports UNB.

The procession from Shantinagar area passed through the city streets and chanted slogans urging people to resist from casting their votes in support of the 12th Constitution amendment bill, the party press release said.

Addressing a meeting after the procession, Vice Chairman of the Party Bazul Huda said the present parliament had failed to fulfil the aspirations of the people since the economic setback, price hike, unemployment and other important national issues remained unresolved, it said.

The meeting held at Shantinagar was also addressed among others by Faruk Reza, City Coordinator of the party.

He warned the nation would become hostage to the vested coterie composed of 330 parliament members if the "so called" 12th amendment was not rejected by the people.

KSP call to vote for BNP in by-elections

Krishak Samik Party President ASM Solaiman Saturday called upon the people to cast their votes for BNP candidates in the by-elections in the interest of stabilising democracy, reports BSS.

Ruhul Quddus was born in 1924 in Satkhira. He took his MA from the Calcutta University and joined Dhaka College as a teacher in 1948. He joined the first batch of CSP in 1949 and held many important positions in the government.

The namaz-e-janaza of the deceased will be held at the Gulshan Mosque today and he will be buried at the Banani grave yard.

Bankers asked to ensure fund for jute traders, exporters

Finance and Planning Minister M Saifur Rahman Saturday underscored the need for availability of timely credit to stimulate economic activities, reports BSS.

He was addressing the Managing Directors of the Nationalised Commercial Banks at a review meeting on credit situation. Senior officials of the ministry and the Bangladesh Bank were also present in the meeting.

Saifur Rahman reiterated the need for timely availability of credit to the jute traders and exporters so that they could enter the market when

the jute growers, particularly smaller ones, bring their products in the market.

He asked the bankers not only to renew the credit limit of the jute traders and exporters who as borrowers have good standing with the banks but also to allow them higher limits on the basis of banker-customer relationship so that they could purchase jute from primary markets.

While reviewing the agro-credit situation, the Minister observed that there was no net credit flow in the agricultural sector in the past two years. This is needed for not only to

maintain the present level of economic activities in the rural sector but also to create new momentum, particularly in the areas affected by cyclone and areas which are flood prone.

The Minister stressed the imperative need for augmenting the flow of agricultural and rural credit.

The bankers were advised that the farmers who have been allowed remission of past credit should be treated as creditors in good standing and allowed access to fresh credit as per norms laid down by the Bangladesh Bank.
