Women can play effective role in improving environment

Women can play an effective role in the improvement of physical environment in areas like housing, garbage disposal, sanitation and water supply. Municipal authorities and NGOs can work together with the nearest women group.

The above recommendations were made at the concluding session of a three-day international seminar on 'Women and Environment' jointly organised by the Bangladesh Geographical Society and the Department of Geography of Dhaka University on Sunday.

It is also recommended that the important role played by women in various sectors of economic production and in environmental management including tree plantation should properly be recognised.

Media should give extensive coverage of their role, it also recommended.

The seminar suggested that the Health and Family Planning departments and the NGOs working on the issue should be activated further to make women aware of health education and family planning methods so that they are not easily exploited.

The seminar supported the Gramscian Bank approach of credit for rural poor women and recommended to extend similar programmes to urban poor women.

It also suggested to set up a commission for reform of inheritance and matrimonial law to ensure legal protection of oppressed women.

It was also stated in the recommendation that the environment policy now being drafted by the Ministry of Environment and national conservation strategy documents should properly highlight the role of women in environment management. Women should also be involved in all environment-related action programmes.

The rounding-up session held at the Gana Shastha Kendra at Nayarhat was chaired by Prof Nazrul Islam, President of the Geographical Society.

Twenty five papers were presented in five working sessions of the seminar by the experts and professionals from the fields of geography, law, social work, sociology, urban planning, population planning and development studies.

Reorganisation of structure suggested

'Education sector a clinically alive patient'

Taka 2,362 crore, has been earmarked for the education sector in the fourth Five-Year Plan (FFYP), which is 5.89 per cent of the total government development allocation, reports BSS.

This was stated by Joint Secretary (Development) of the Ministry of Education Nooruddin Mahmud Kamal while presenting a key-note paper Sunday on 'our education policy and alternate structure' on the occasion of International Literacy Day.

The sector-wise allocation in the education sector during the FFYP (1990-95) is 50 per cent for the primary education, 26 per cent for Madrasa and secondary education, nine per cent for technical education and 11 per cent for university education.

Kamal said the real expenditure in the education sector in the Third Five-Year Plan was Taka 1,170 crore, which was 4.6 per cent of the total development expenditure while it was Taka 482 crore in the second five-year plan, 3.5 per cent of the development budget. Taka 258 crore was spent in the education sector during the first Five Year Plan which was 3.3 per cent of the total planned expenditure.

Kamal said facilities in the education sector have been increased substantially.

'No alternative to practical training'

State Minister for Labour and Manpower Rafiqul Islam Mia Monday said that there was no alternative to practical training for a technical student to ensure his professional competence, reports UNB.

He said this while inaugurating the installation ceremony of the newly elected students' union of the Bangladesh Institute of Marine Engineers at Narayanganj on Monday morning.

Flood-hit people assured of govt help

State Minister for Relief Lutfar Rahman Monday visited flood affected area Char Ashrafadah under Godagari upazila of Rajshahi district, reports BSS.

State Minister for LGRD and Cooperatives, Kabir Hossain accompanied him during the visit.

During the visit the State Minister for Relief enquired about the welfare of the flood affected people.

The government budget for the education sector is less than two per cent of the national income, he said.

The Joint Secretary said allocation in the education sector can be raised by limiting expenditure in other sectors of the state especially in the non-development sectors.

Kamal suggested re-organisation of the structure of the entire education system considering the reality. He compared the education sector of the country with a 'clinically alive' patient.

There is a huge educational structure spread over

the country. A child can easily make exit from the higher education after entering the door of primary education without going deep into the education," he said. In this way, a parasitic educated class is being made dependent on nearly 70 per cent illiterates.

Kamal said, in the light of recurring expenditure of the government, per student annual expense is Taka 440 in the government primary school, Taka 4,135 in the Madrasa, Taka 23,510 in the cadet college and Taka 17,000 in the university.

They said the allegations against Syed Mesbahuddin were fabricated and baseless.
