The flood in the Ganges basin covering the greater districts of Rajshahi, Kushtia, Faridpur and Pabna is likely to turn severe. The districts of Gaibandha, Sirajganj, Jamalpur, Tangail, Manikganj and Dhaka may also experience flooding above the normal

The late monsoon floods have so far affected 22 districts. These are -Rangour. Gaibandha, Kurigram, Lalmonirhat, Thakurgaon, Panchagarh, Pabna, Sirajganj, Rajshahi, Chapainawabgani, Kushtia, Netrokona, Brahmanbaria, Sylhet, Manikgani, Bogra, Jamalpur, Kishoreganj, Naryanganj Dhaka, Faridpur and Tangail.

A special bulletin issued by the Flood Information Centre of the Water Development Board last night said that the information received from neighboring India suggested that the water level of the Ganges at Farraka was rising and was about to approach the record level.

The bulletin further said that the country's overall flood situation was likely to aggra-

The authorities have requested all officials concerned to remain alert and take adequate precautions for the safety of life and property in the face of a deteriorating flood situation.
