## Influenza spreading fast

Sept 10 : Influenza has been spreading in all the upazilas of the district, affecting 75 to 80 per cent of the people so far, district health officials said, reports UNB.

The worst affected upazilas are: Karimganj, Tarail, Itana, Mitamain, Hossainpur, Bhairab, Bajitpur, Katiadi and Sadar.

Almost every family in these upazilas have one or more patients, they said.

Doctors and health teams who visited the affected areas, said bad sanitation during rainy scason, change of weather and consumption of adulterated foodstuff, could be the reason for the viral infection.

## Villagers protest killing of a young man

Sept 10: The villagers of Pabahati under the pourashava brought out a procession Sunday in protest against the killing of a young man Kawsar Ali of the same village and demanded trial of the killers, reports UNB.

According to witnesses, Kawsar Ali was killed by some assailants on Saturday noon.

The processionists paraded the main thoroughfares of the town with the body of Kawsar and chanted various slogans in favour of their demands.

They also demanded immediate arrest of the persons responsible for the killing.

#### Tumour weighing 5 kgs removed from abdomen

Sept 10: A big tumour weighing about five kgs was removed from the abdomen of a woman recently when she was operated upon at a private clinic here, reports BSS.

According to the clinic

source, Hasina Begum (50) of Bhanga upazila of this district was admitted to the clinic with acute kidney ailment and hypertension. After necessary investigations it was found that the left kidney of the patient had been abnormally enlarged. Dr. Zahidul Haque, Consultant Surgeon of Faridpur General Hospital operated upon the patient and removed a big-size tumour weighing about five kgs. The kidney which became non-functioning was also removed. The operation was successful and the patient has already been released from the

The surgeon told BSS that this type of tumour in the kidney is rare. He said that the tumour has been preserved and would be sent to Bangladesh College of Physicians and Surgeons for further investigations.

#### Rickshawpuller killed in road mishap

Sept19: One rickshawpuller was killed and another received serious injuries when a speedy truck dashed two rickshaws at Dhanghara, three kilometre away from here on Saturday, reports UNB.

According to police and eyewitnesses, two rickshawpullers, Jamiruddin (30) o village Bahadurpur and Abdus Sabur (20) of village Tangojani under Sadar upazila while coming from a by-lane of Gatbandha-Palashbari highway were dashed by the truck (Dhaka Metro Na 6442) bound for Palashbart from behind Jamiruddin died on the spot.

# Prices of essentials go up in Chuadanga

CHUADANGA, Sept 10: Prices of all essential commodities have shot up in Chuadanga causing great hardships to the general consumers particularly to the lowincome groups.

Prices of rice, sugar, pulses, fish, meat and edible oil have registered a sharp rise. Masoor a popular pulse now sells at Taka 28 per kilo and Khesari which is largely consumed by the low-income groups is now being sold at Taka 20 to 24 per kilogram. Prices of spices particularly garlic and onion have gone up abnormally. Garlic is now being sold at Taka 40 per kg and onion Taka

18 to 20 per kg. Prices of rice has also gone up abruptly tough the harvesting of Aus paddy is still in progress. Rice is being sold in local markets between Taka 11.50 and 14.00 per kg.

#### BKB to disburse Tk 4.70 crore

GAIBANDIIA, Sept 10: BDR personnel recovered Indian contraband items worth over Taka one lakh from a Dhakabound night coach recently.
