Production to fall by 33 pc

Bangladesh is likely to import over 800 tons of excess rubber annually for the next five to six years as about one third of the rubber trees planted by the Forest Industries Development Corporation (FIDC) were damaged in the April 29 cyclone.

About eight lakh rubber trees were damaged in the cyclone which lashed the coastal areas. FIDC has about 26 lakh trees in its rubber projects.

These trees produced about 2,000 tons of rubber annually, sources said. But after the cyclone, production will fall by 33 per cent of the previous quantity. The loss due to the disaster is estimated at Taka 30 crore.

Sources said, FIDC has not yet started any new plantation programme to cover up the loss. However, hectic moves have been going on to bag grant from donors for plantation programme. Some proposals have also been submitted to the ministries and Planning Commission, sources

Rubber experts said even if new trees are planted now, it will take about another six to seven years for them to be ready to collect rubber. Meanwhile, the cost involved in the maintenance of the trees will be very high.

The collection of rubber from the existing trees will gradually increase over the

Everyone is making hay while the sun shines, but the end of the road can never be very far of.

of the country, experts said. Presently, there are about 150 rubber product manufacturing units. These units need about 6,000 tons of rubber annually. About 60 per cent of the demand has to be met by import. The rest is met locally.

Sources said the rehabilitation programme for the damaged rubber projects will need at least Taka 15 crore initially. It will take about two years to complete the programme. Experts pointed out that the total time for collection of rubber from the new trees will take at least eight years, two years for plantation and six years for maturity of the trees.

FIDC had started a rubber. project in Madhupur area in 1987 and completed in 1989. About 7.50 lakh trees were planted under the scheme. But it will take at least another five years for maturity of the trees.

FIDC sources said there are high prospect of rubber plantation in the northern part of the country. The Forest Department once planted some rubber trees in a limited area in Dinajpur. But these trees were not ever tapped ever since. Sources observed that these trees needs to be tapped to get an idea about the quality of rubber produced in the region and also the prospect of rubber plantation in the northern part.

day (Saturday). A dollar under the Wage Earners Scheme will now cost Taka 38:44. The rate was Taka

37.64 till Thursday. This is the fourth time devaluation of Taka in the last two and a half month. After the news broke out in the banking sector, the rate of dollar in the private exchange shot up to Taka 43 per dollar.

Taka has been devalued for 50 times in the last 20 years after the independence. The cost of a dollar in 1972-73 was Taka 7.88. In 1974-75, the rate was Taka 8.88 while the next year the price was Taka 15.05. In 1980-81, the exchange rate was Taka 20.11 and after 10 years time, it shot up to Taka 36.58 in 1990-91.

Singapore Airlines (SIA) has placed orders for 20 Airbus Industrie A340-300 aircraft, in the improved version, worth US\$ 3.355 billion, inclusive of the cost of spares and spare engines. Deliveries will be

made between 1995 and 1998.

The improved A340-300 differs from the basic version in having a heavier maximum take-off weight (267 tonnes) and payload capacity (43 tonnes), and in being equipped with a more powerful engine. It is a wide-bodied, four-engined, long-range aircraft, with an advanced aftloaded wing and fly-by-wire flight-control system, among other technological innovations. It is powered by the CMF 56-5C4 engine, generating

34,000-lb of thrust. The A340-300 in SIA's configuration will have 270 scats-18 in first class, 48 in business, and 204 in economy. It will be deployed on certain long-haul European routes, as well as pioncer new services that do not justify a B747-400 Megatop.

SIA is not proceeding with its previously-announced plan to purchase MD-11 aircraft from McDonnell Douglas Corporation. The intended purchase of the MD-11 was

predicated on the aircraft's ability to perform certain longhaul sectors, Singapore-Paris for example, with defined payload capability. While the aircraft is excellent for shorter range requirements, it has not to-date been able to meet SIA's

World Bank excludes scandal-hit Japanese securities cos from global bond trading

TOKYO, Sept 13 : The World Bank will exclude scandal-tainted Nomura Securities Co Ltd and Nikko Securities Co Ltd as underwriters for its upcoming global bond issue, a Japanese newspaper reported Wednesday, says AFP.

The bank took the decision after recent admissions by the two companies that their affiliates lent funds to a leading Japanese underworld figure, the Nihon Keizai Shimbun quoted informed sources in New York as saying.

The bank takes the case of their transactions with a crime syndicate very seriously." it quoted one of the sources as

The World Bank's office here refused to comment on the report, but a spokesman, said the bank would be planning its fifth global bond issue of between 1.5 and two billion Dollars in the next few weeks.

Nomura said Nikko have both been included in previous syndicates chosen to underwrite the four global bond issue, the spokesman said.

The group usually comprises between 10 and fifteen financial institutions from Japan, the United States and Europe.

The World Bank, a multilateral agency based in Washington has also reportedly barred Wall Street bond-trading giant Salomon Brothers Inc from the upcoming issue because of its irregularities at US treasury bond auctions.

Nomura, the world biggest securities firm, and Nikko, ranked fourth in Japan, said they had not been officially informed of the bank's decision.
