Attacks on BNP leaders slated

Bangladesh Nationalist Party has condemned the attack at the residences of its leaders and workers after the by-election, reports BSS.

In a protest statement Saturday night, the party said Awami League workers had blasted bombs at the residence of BNP leader Azizul Islam Kajaal at Rayerbazar in the city at about 10.30 pm Friday night. Besides, the statement said, residences of BNP leaders and workers also came under at-

tack at various places including Jigatala, and tannery crossing. The party asked all concerned to refrain from such activities.

Meanwhile, Mir Shawkat Ali and Salauddin Ahmed, MP, President and General Secretary respectively of the city BNP unit, Saturday condemned the attack on the Ward No.42 BNP and Chhatra Dal offices in Sutrapur by the armed 'Mujibbadi hoodlums'.

They demanded punishment of the persons responsible for the incident.

Kazi Abul Bashar, President of the Sutrapur Thana BNP also condemned the attack.

In another statement, Abul Khair Bhuiyan and Nasiruddin Ahmed Pintu, President and General Secretary respectively of the Chhatra Dal Dhaka city unit, condemned the attack on BNP, Jubodal and Chhatra Dal offices by the Mujibbadi armed activists.

They said armed Mujibbadi activists attacked Tejgaon Chhatra Dal leader Naimur Rahman Mayem and demanded punishment of the persons responsible for the attacks.

A meeting also condemned the attack on its Dhaka City Unit President Mir Shawkat Ali, MP, and Jubodal leader Abdul Wahed.

The meeting held at Section No.12 was presided over by Alhaj AKM Moazzem Hossain, President of the Ward No.2. It was addressed, among others, by member of the city executive committee Makrul Ahsan Habib Ahsan and Chhatra Dal leader Kazi Azizul Huq.

Speakers at the meeting condemned the armed attack by the 'Mujibbadi' Chhatra League activists.

More relief for flood victims

The Ministry of Relief Saturday sanctioned 165 tonnes of wheat, 145 tonnes of rice, 1250 pieces of sarce, 1250 pieces of lungi and Taka 1,80,000 in cash as gratuitous relief for the flood-affected people, reports BSS.

The relief materials and money were sanctioned for the districts Kurigram, Rangpur, Jaipurhat, Bogra, Dhaka, Munshiganj, Lalmonirhat and Sirajganj.

The total quantum of relief materials sanctioned for the flood victims till yesterday stands at 875 tonnes of wheat, 660 tonnes of rice, 8750 pieces of sarce, 8600 pieces of lungi, 6765 tins of biscuit and Taka 15,45,000 in cash and other materials.

UZ Chairmen urged to motivate people for 'yes' vote

Tk 111 cr for 599 projects taken up for Ctg city development

CHITTAGONG, Sept 14: Chittagong City Corporation (CCC) Mayor Mir M Nasir Uddin today said that the corporation had taken up 599 projects worth over Taka 111 crore for implementation during the next five years, reports BSS.

He said the projects spread over 41 wards of the corporation would be implemented in phases. Development of roads and lanes, construction of culverts and drains were included in the projects, he said.

Talking to newsmen at the conference room of the CCC this afternoon he said the government had granted Taka 7 crore for execution of the projects of which Taka 4 crore

had already been received while the rest was in pipe line. He said the CCC was expected to receive Taka 20 crore from Asian Development Bank and Taka 40 crore from the World Bank for implementation of the projects. The rest of the amount would be arranged by the corporation from its own and other sources, he added.

State Minister for Forest, Fisheries and Environment, Abdullah Al-Noman, Serajul Islam MP, Ms Rozy Kabir MP, Amir Khashru Mahmud Chowdhury MP-elect and Advocate Badrul Anwar, Acting President of city BNP were also present.

Mayor Nasir Uddin said all uplift projects of the corpora-

tion would be executed taking the local people and political leaders into confidence. In this connection, he said all party development committee had already been constituted in order to associate people with development works of the corporation.

He said the corporation had a burden of over Taka 13 crore in arrears payment and that the amount had been brought down to Taka 6 crore by now. He said the city corporation had issued 11,000 new trade licences during the past four months raising the total number of licences to over 27 thousands.

He said there was 1,700 metric tons of wheat in corporation store and the same would be utilised under test relief programme for development of roads and lanes in the corporation area. We have taken strict measures to check any sort of corruption in executing test relief programmes by associating local people, he said.

Mayor Nasir Uddin sought the cooperation of all political parties and citizens in implementing uplift programmes of the corporation.

'Govt to give no shelter to anarchism'

Minister for Education and Cultural Affairs Prof A G M Badruddoza Chowdhury Saturday called upon the people of all walks of life to cast 'yes' vote in the referendum for establishing the government responsible to the people, reports BSS.

The minister was addressing a big public meeting at Srinagar stadium under Munshiganj district Saturday afternoon.

Prof Chowdhury said BNP government would give no shelter to anarchism and violence. He opined that the people would show respect to democratic values for strengthening the democracy. He also called upon the people to help restore peace and stability and to create an atmosphere for practicing democracy in the country.

Organised by the Upazila BNP, the meeting was addressed, among others, by Abdul Ilie, MP, Hamidullah Khan, MP, Secretary of District BNP Majibur Rahman, Jubodal leaders Salim Hossain Khan and Moazzem Hossain Khan and Upazila Chairman Kazi Azizul Huq.

power. He said the referendum would provide an opportunity for the people to choose the system of the government for materialising their hopes and aspirations.

State Minister for Religious Affairs, Prof M A Mannan has said that the present government under the leadership of Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia believes in equal rights and privileges of the women to achieve overall development in every spheres of social life, reports BSS.

He was addressing as chief guest a seminar on 'the equality of men and women's prerequisite for world peace' organised by National Bahal Centre in Dhaka on Friday.

Prof Mannan said the government has full respect for the UN Charter of Human Rights and as such a harmonious relations of men and women irrespective of caste, religion and colour have been established in Bangladesh. In this context, he said the communal harmony now prevailing in Bangladesh is of rare precedence in the world. He urged the Bahal of Bangladesh to work hand in hand with the other Bangladeshis for the development of the country.

Dateline Chittagong
'Chittagong to be second capital'

CHITTAGONG, Sept 14: State Minister for Forest, Fisheries and Environment Abdullah Al-Noman today said that the government was contemplating to turn Chittagong into second capital of the country, reports BSS.

He said Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia had expressed her desire to elevate the port city to the status of second capital through implementing of a master plan in phases.

Addressing a press conference at Chittagong City Corporation Conference Hall this afternoon he said Chittagong Development Authority (CDA) had been asked to prepare a Taka 14 crore new master plan for Chittagong which would be implemented in phases. He said, the government had already granted Taka 7 crore for Chittagong City Corporation for development of roads and lanes during the coming dry season while a second export processing zone would be constructed on the other side of the river Karnaphuli.

Chittagong remained neglected for long nine years during the ousted autocratic rule as a result of which peo-

ple got frustrated, he said adding BNP government would give greater attention to the port city as was pledged by Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia during February 27 parliamentary polls.

Noman said people of all shades on opinion would be taken into confidence while implementing development projects in Chittagong. In this connection, he called upon the leaders of different political parties to extend their cooperation to the Chittagong City Corporation in executing various uplift projects.

Referring to September 11 by-election he said it was a free and fair election and that all allegations raised by Bangladesh Awami League were false and motivated. He particularly mentioned that in Chittagong-8 constituency Awami League leaders and workers let loose a terrorism to scare the voters so that they did not turn up to cast their votes. Awami League activists exploded bombs and crackers and intimidated voters in Lalkhan Bazar, Commerce College area, Pathantooly, Mansurabad and some other areas of the constituency to scare the women voters, he

said.

He also said Awami League activists were continuing terrorist activities in the constituency even after the election. He cited Chittagong Medical College incident in this respect where some JCD workers were attacked and injured by BCL activists on Thursday.

He added that Awami League activists injured scores of BNP and JCD workers at different areas of the constituency and that some of them were undergoing treatment in the hospitals.

He said the half-day hartal called by Awami League Saturday would seriously disturb September 15-referendum as people were frustrated by the same.

Abdullah Al Noman urged opposition political parties to refrain from creating chaos and confusion in the country at a time when the democratic process was going to be given an institutional shape. The political parties and the people unitedly struggled to oust autocratic government of Ershad and now is the time to ensure a congenial atmosphere to give hard earned democracy an institutional shape, he added.
