ground are the high rise buildings of the city. "This is true reflection of our society_ what man has done to man," he commented. The swirls and sweeps of colours prevent the picture from being photographic. In another piece

he shows a girl crossing a risky bridge ,once again with multistoried buildings in the background. "In Dhaka there is an exhibition of wealth on one side and dire poverty in another. There is, for instance the

VIP road that camouflages poverty and ugliness from the foreign visitors," the artist remarked. On yet another canvas the painter shows the lanes of Old Dhaka and dominating it is a University student or a working girl. The feeling of insecurity in the girl is apparent. On the road is a mask which is suggestive of a person she

has been chased by or frightened with. Even

the branches of the trees denote horror and unknown evil. There is terror in the large lotus eyes of the girl while she has her hand clasped to her heart to express overwhelming, untold fear". She has apparently no one in the world and feels insecure," the artist commented. In the painting "Bishmoy" we see a horse staring aghast at an angry red sky. The horse

represents people who are struggling. The herse also symbolises the Moghuls who brought imperialism to the land. There is an old broken fort in the backround. Lines cut up the picture. "The stratled horse stands for the people who are confused by social and political conditions. They are full of fear and helplessness. For most people life is an endless and

"They were not treated as human beings_ if you gave them a little money you could have them at your command. This is just a flash of the feudal society of the past. I have portrayed Ahsan Manzil as more broken and shattered than it is now in reality." Ali Imam add-






