

Student groups continue protests in DU

Provost body warns stern action

The Provost Committee of the Dhaka University at an emergency meeting threatened stern action if hindrances to the performing of their duties were not removed immediately.

The meeting said that the administrative activities of the university were often being hindered by terrorist acts. It resented the situation and demanded immediate solution to the problems.

The meeting sought the co-operation of the political leaders in keeping the university open and the activities of the hall administration normal.

It demanded neutral measures by the government to punish the persons involved in terrorism for the sake of

keeping the university open.

The Provost meeting attended by the Assistant Proctor and the House Tutors expressed grave concern over the recent incidents of ransacking the offices in Registrar's building and damaging of the cars of the registrar and a teacher and strongly condemned the incidents.

It also condemned the ransacking of the residences of the Provost of the Jagannath Hall and House Tutor of S M Hall and demanded punishment to the persons involved.

Meanwhile, various student organisations continued protests against recent incidents on the campus by holding rallies and processions on

Thursday.

A tense situation was prevailing on the campus following slogans and counter-slogans by the rival student groups.

Jattiyabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD), the student wing of the BNP, in its rally held at the 'Aparajoo Bangla' accused the Awami League-backed Chhatra League (S-A) of creating anarchy in the educational institutions.

It reiterated its resentment of the BCL (S-A) for providing shelter to the 'identified killers' of Dr Shamsul Alam Khan Milon and obstructing the police in arresting them.

The JCD rally pointed out that JCD expelled Obhi and his associates from the organisation

according to the written suggestion of the now defunct All Party Students Unity (APSU) which was also signed by one of the central leaders of the BCL.

So, the JCD rally added, the BCL betrayed the student community by sheltering those miscreants.

The rally was addressed by DUCSU General Secretary Khairul Kabir Khokon, Assistant General Secretary Nazimuddin Alam, JCD Joint Convenor Fazul Huq Milon, Qumruzzaman Ratan, Elias Ali, Rafiqul Islam Jaglu and Shahiduddin Chowdhury Anec.

Chhatra League (S-A) rally addressed by Golam Mostafa Suzan and Quamruzzaman Ansari accused the BNP's student front for unleashing terrorism in the educational institutions.

The rally alleged that the BNP government was trying to foil the student movement for realising the ten-point demand by various repressive measures.

JSD (Inu)-backed Chhatra League (N-S) rally held at the Madhu's Canteen premises condemned Tuesday night's police action on the innocent students and the ransacking of the valuable properties of the university.

The rally addressed by Roknuzzaman Rokon also condemned the BCL (S-A) for providing shelter to the alleged killers of Dr Milon.

Bangladesh Chhatra Federation rally addressed by Fazul Hakim accused the government and the political parties for the deterioration of the situation in the educational institutions and demanded its immediate solution.

Meanwhile, the presence of students in the classes and the residential halls was thin till Thursday as the fear of further deterioration of the campus situation increased significantly in last two days.

First year classes of JU likely to begin Nov 2

The classes of the first year student of the academic year 1990-91 of Jahangirnagar University are likely to begin on November 2, an official source told BSS.

It said the decision to this effect will be taken within a few days.

A total of 687 students were admitted this year in 18 departments of the university, of them 164 are female student. This is the highest number of students admitted in the university during the last four years.

This year the university authority has introduced a subject, archaeology, first of its kind in any Bangladeshi university.

Meanwhile, the university authority has also decided to introduce integrated courses in all the departments. As a result, the students from this year will not have to take subsidiary subjects in honours classes.

A noble example of maintaining peace in HSC exams centre

CHITTAGONG, Sept 20: Nizampur College under Mirsarai Upazila here has set up a noble example of maintaining peace and order in and around its HSC examination centre in cooperation with local people, reports BSS.

The college authority has constituted a 20-member committee with the cross section of people and headed by the college principal, Monem Billah, to check any untoward incident and ensure maintenance of peace and discipline on the campus during the HSC examination which began on September 12.

The college authority was prompted to constitute the committee following an untoward incident after expulsion of 12 HSC examinees for adopting unfair means. The expelled examinees in collaboration with some outsiders started an agitation to get the expulsion order withdrawn immediately. They blocked

Dhaka-Chittagong highway near the college for 50 minutes and created a pandemonium on the college campus to frustrate holding of the examination.

The situation was going out of control but the principal of the college and some teachers called upon the local people and some ex-students of the college to help maintain peace at the centre. The local people, right from rickshaw-pullers to the lawyers responded favourably and built up strong resistance against the agitators. The people did not support the expelled students and as such they failed to carry out their design of closing down the examination centre which was restored this year after two years of suspension. The college had been an HSC examination centre for long 18 years in the past.

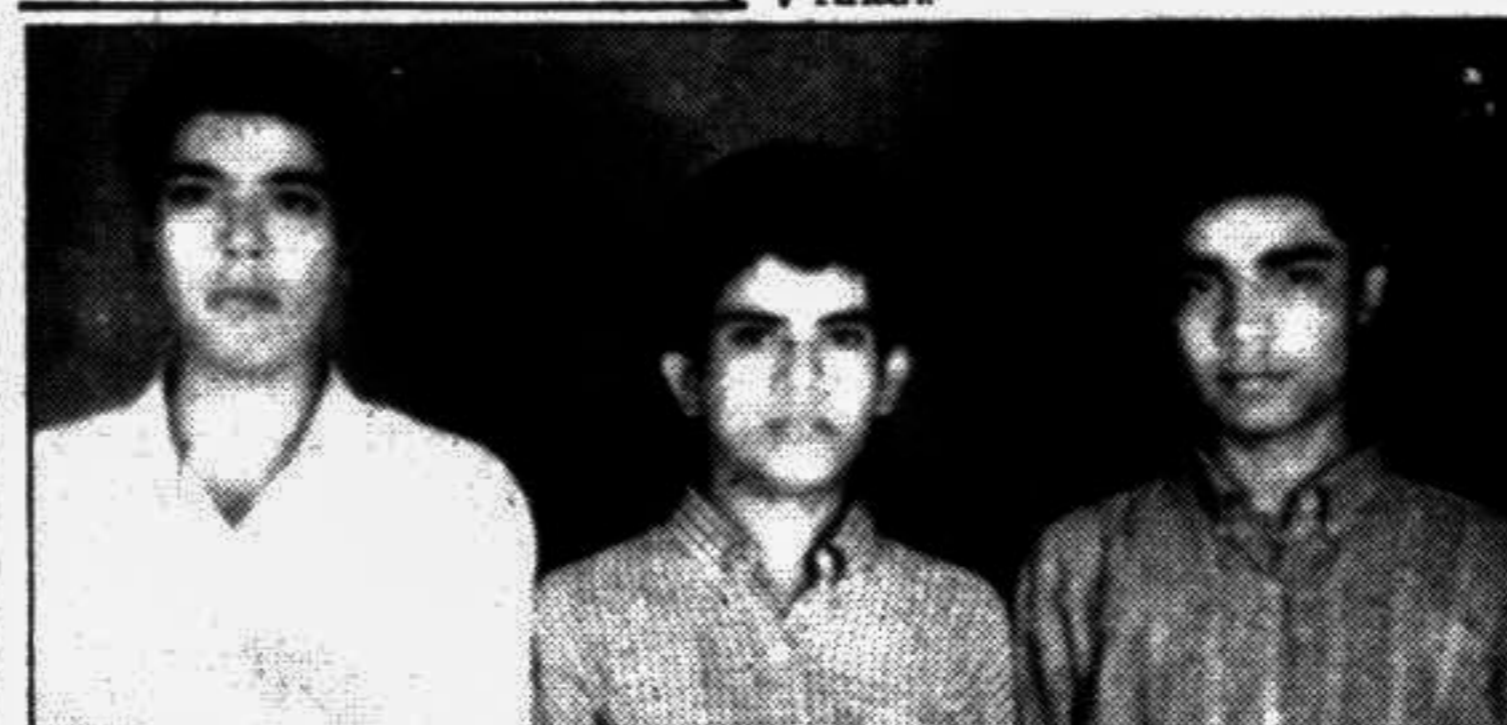
The college authority and the local people held a five-hour meeting to decide upon as to how to maintain peace and order at the examination centre. They constituted a 20-member committee consisting of teachers, guardians, persons interested in education, former student leaders and others. The committee, has the backing of the local people and thus the negligible number of trouble makers dared not create any trouble in and around the examination centre. The police and the local administration have also extended full cooperation in this respect.

On the second day of the examination 24 more examinees were expelled from the centre for adoption of unfair

means and there was no hue and cry over this. Every body in the locality is convinced that wrong does not have the support of the people, said principal Monem Billah.

Nizampur College, established a quarter century ago, has over 3000 students. It has a good tradition of maintaining peace and discipline and better results.

Principal Monem Billah is optimistic about maintaining a congenial atmosphere in the examination.
