Killing of JCD leader protested

Sept 20 : About 500 activists of Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) brought out processions protesting the killing of local JCD leader Shahjahan Noor Mithu here on September 19, reports UNI3.

The processionists paraded the main thoroughfares of the town and staged two and half hour's sit-in demonstration in front of the Deputy Commissioner's office.

Later they held a protest meeting at the same venue with Anwarul Islam Badsha in the chair and handed over a memorandum to the DC demanding immediate arrest of the killers of Mithu.

To avoid the untoward incident the authorities were forced to suspend the classes in the educational institutions of the town, the sources added.

Over 1.60 lakh saplings distributed

Sept 20 : Forest Department has distributed over 1.60 lakh saplings among the people as part of the afforestation programme during the current season, reports

Informed sources said, about 1700 acres of land is being brought under intensive afforestation in the coastal areas of the district.

Of the total, 1200 acres will be brought under Keroa planting and the rest under various fruit and flower bearing plants.

Besides, Forest Department has taken up a programme to produce over 4 lakh saplings in its nurseries at Patuakhali, Barguna for distribution among the people next year.

The local people urged the authorities to ensure successful implementation of the afforestation programme in the char areas of the district, severely hit by the last cyclone.

Besides, number of doctors is not adequate to cope with the increasing number of patients. Many of the doctors also remain absent adding miscries of the patients.

Patients complained that they are compelled to buy medicines from outsiders at an exorbitant price.

3 jailed for murder

Floods cause extensive damage to lives, property

RANGPUR, Sept 20: Recent flood due to heavy downpour and onrush of river water caused extensive damage to lives, properties and crops in all eight upazilas of the district, reports UNB.

According to official sources, six unidentified persons including two children died during the flood. Of them, three died in Sadar upazila, one in Mithapukur upazila and two in Bodorganj upazila of the district.

sources said, flood water engulfed 58 out of 83 unions of the district affecting about 7 lakh and 50 thousand people. Most of these people are

2000 ponds lying unutilised

SATKHIRA, Sept 20 : About 2000 ponds in seven upazilas of the district have been lying uncultivated mainly due to dis-

pute among the owners. According to a reliable source, if these ponds were reexcavated and brought under pisciculture, a huge quantity of fish worth Taka four crores might be produced in the dis-

It is mentionable that 60 per cent of ponds are under share ownership have got silted and dried up due to lack of maintenance. On the other hand numerous ponds are lying covered with water hyacinth in which fish cultivation is impossible.

It a comprehensive scheme is not taken a large number of ponds will be left unused incurring heavy loss, the source added.

The sources further said that concerned authorities should come forward with a motivation and approach of cooperative farming to the shareholders of the ponds so that they could realise their loss and get inspiration.

Meanwhile, catching of fish fry is continuing unabatedly in the district shattering the prospect of fish production. Current nets are being used for this purpose. The fish fries are being sold openly in the district town and upazilas hats and bazars at cheap rates despite government ban on catching fish fries below nine inches. Fishes in huge quantities are being marketed every day in all the hats and bazars.

According to the experts, fish scareity will intensify again in near future due to rampant catching of fries. The law cnforcing agencies are yet to take positive steps against these illegal catching.

NARAYANGANJ, Sept 20 One person was killed and 10 others were injured, two seriously, when a passengers' bus crushed three autorickshaws simultaneously near Morgapara under Sonargaon upazila 15 km away from Narayanganj.

Meghna erosion turns alarming in Chandpur

CHANDPUR, Sept 20 Erosion of the river Meghna at Chandpur has taken an alarming turn threatening existence of railway station, launch terminal, and steamer ghat at Nutunbazar, reports BSS.

Half of a century old rathway station, hilsha fish market and two adjacent business firms have already gone into the river. Chandpur town protection embankment has been breached at several points. Boulders dropped to stop the crosion along the bank had been washed away by severe current. Puranbazar Girls High School, century-old Hindu temple and 30 business firms were washed away. The erosion has been continuing for

the last two days. Meghna erosion at Haimchar upazila eight miles from Chandpur town rendered about ten thousand people
