


them victorious ultimately.

Holy Land: The Prophet's mosque at Medina



Fahd Bin Abdul Aziz several Saudia flights rushed to Dhaka with initial help such as foodstuff, blankets, tents, medicines etc. to mitigate sufferings of the cyclone victims.

King Fahd's special instruction to concerned Saudi government authority to allocate an amount of 400,000,000/ (106 million US dollar) to help for reconstruction of the devastated area and voluntary raising of funds by Saudi private philanthropic organizations and visit of the representatives of Islamic World Relief Organization to the affected areas, and above all, formation of fund raising committees by the Governor of Riyadh Prince Salman Bin Abdul Aziz, and the Governor of Aseer, Prince Khaled Al-Faisal, as well as other generous people of different regions of Saudi Arabia.

The eight projects in which the Saudi grant will be utilised envisages construction of multipurpose buildings to accommodate schools, mosques, clinics which can also be used as shelters during disasters, construction of houses for the worst victims, reconstruction of two telecommunication towers at Chittagong and micro-wave telecommunication

link at Betbunia and Chittagong, supply of drinking water, reconstruction of food storage godowns, import of fertilizer, restoration of electricity transmission line and reconstruction of embankments in the coastal areas.

May Allah give us strength to hold fast our unshakable faith in Him so that we can fulfil our obligations towards the welfare of the Muslim Ummah, and for that matter, the humanity at large.
