Minor girl killed, 3 of a family injured in explosion

By Staff Correspondent A minor girl was killed and her two siblings along with their mother were seriously injured when a bomb exploded at their Gonoktuli Sweeper Colony home in Azimpur Tuesday morning.

The bomb contained in a tin-can was collected by the girl. Hassora Begum (5) from a dustbin.

Hassora Begum, as part of her daily chore, returned home at around 7 am with a sackful of waste paper and tincans collected from dustbins around the Azimpur area and gleefully told her mother, Kompaninessa Bibi, (30), that she may have found something valuable in a heavy tin-can.

When she emptied the contents of the sack on the floor of the hut, the "heavy tin-can" exploded injuring three of the children and the mother. "I don't even know what all

she had brought, I couldn't even have a look at it before the explosion rocked our house," lamented Kompaninessa Bibi from her hospital bed. She had just returned home after delivering water at some homes nearby, she added.

Her husband, Abdul Baset Mian (50), was at work as a loader at the Nawabganj Bazar at the time of the accident.

Local people rushed the injured to the Dhaka Medical College Hospital where Hassora succumbed to the injuries in the afternoon.

Her younger brother. Mosharraf (3), lost the middle and index finger of his left hand and also sustained lacerations to his forehead and body. Her elder sister, Hazera Begum (6), and her mother also sustained serious lacerat ing injuries to the body.

WB team to reassess Jamuna bridge project

A high-powered World Bank mission arrives today to assess the prospect of the proposed Jamuna Multi-purpose Bridge project (JMB).

Nazim Ahmed Chowdhury. Chairman of the JMB told The Daily Star that the World Bank mission would make a fresh assessment on the feasibility of the bridge.

The international tender for construction of the bridge was scheduled to be floated last December but due to nonavailability of funds it was de-

The feasibility study of the project done by RPT, NIDECO and Bangladesh Consultants Limited in 1989 showed that the construction of the bridge including its one-way railway tracks would cost a total of 450 million dollars.

Later, an aid-memoire prepared by the World Bank recommended an early floating of tender for construction of the bridge. Because, as it stated delay in floating of tender may cause escalation in the prices of construction materials.

It further recommended the floating of tender by December 1990 at the latest.

Otherwise construction cost of the bridge may increase by 20 per cent, it added. But because of the non-

availability of the commitments from the donors for the required funds it was not possible to float the tender within the stipulated time.

According to sources within the JMB project authorities the donors may this time impose new conditions on the Bangladesh government including the setting up of DESA and other structural adjustments as per recommendation of the World Bank and IMF before making any commitment.

Earlier the Asian Development Bank had committed to provide 150 million US dollars and the World Bank had committed to give 100 million US dollars for construction of the bridge. But the authorities still lack 200 million US dollars more to float the tender.

Meanwhile, Prime Minister Khaleda Zia during her recent visit to North Bengal declared that the tender of the bridge will be floated by the end of

Diarrhoea claimed 31 more lives in the flood affected districts Tuesday raising the death toll to 467 since September 1.

According to official sources, another 2387 persons were attacked with diarrhea Tuesday. Nearly 27 thousand people have so far been attacked by the disease in the 23 flood affected districts.

Government has set up 14 temporary medical camps in the flood stricken northern districts to arrest the spread of diarrhoea.
