Premadasa faces heckling in Parliament

COLOMBO, Sept 24: Beleaguered President Ranasinghe Premadasa abruptly went off state radio today while addressing parliament a mid unprecedented heckling by legislators campaigning to impeach him, reports AFP.

The live broadcast of Premadasa went off the air and was replaced by music as listeners heard noisy protests and insults hurled at Premadasa as he made his policy statement. The radio gave no reason for the interruption.

The government's television did not telecast the inauguration of parliament, suspended by Premadasa 2 days ago in a calculated move to delay impeachment proceedings against him, even though it had earlier planned to do so.

Premadasa was speaking about his achievements in the economic sphere when the radio went off the air.

The opposition Sri Lanka Freedom Party (SLFP) had earlier said it was "incongruous and ludicrous" for Premadasa to reopen a parliament without first facing trail. The SLFP had vowed to question Premadasa at length.

A powerful section of the governing United National Party (UNP) and the opposition has linked Premadasa to an arms scandal involving supplies to the main Tamil guerilla group accused of

Kishoreganj reports that diarrhoea has been spreading alarmingly in the district which claimed 65 lives in three weeks. District civil surgeon however confirmed 52 deaths. Over two thousand people were attacked by the disease.

Our Rangpur correspondent adds: Diarrhoea broke out in an epidemic form in the five districts of greater Rangpur. Scarcity of drinking water has worsened the situation. Stock of medicine with the district health authorities is not adequate to tackle the situation.

Meanwhile, flood situation again deteriorated in Pabna, Sirajganj and Noagaon due to heavy rains and downflow of waters from upper catchment areas. Low lying areas of Pabna town have been inundated.

Water Development sources said the Padma at Hardinge point was flowing 3 cm below the danger level Tuesday while the Jamuna at Nagarbari point 8 cm below the danger mark.

The sources feared that rivers might cross the flood level if incessant rainfall con-

Meanwhile, a 12-year-old boy. Stalin, was drowned in flood waters Tuesday morning. Over one lakh people in 8


unions of Tarash upazila of Sirajganj district were rendered homeless by onrush of flood water from the upstream and continued rainfall during the last 24 hours.

Soviet army ordered not to interfere in internal conflicts

MOSCOW, Sept 24: The Soviet Defence Ministry has instructed regional military commanders not to intervene in ethnic conflicts in sovereign republics. Tass reported Tuesday.

The announcement by Armed Forces Chief of Staff Gen. Vladimir Lobov follows Monday's order by one regional commander of the Soviet troops not be used in Tadzhikistan to enforce a state of emergency. Tass said.

Col. Gen. Ivan Fuzhenko. commander of the Turkestan Military District, ordered that no Soviet troops in Central Asia be deployed in Tadzhikistan where thousands of people have massed outside the republic's parliament buildings for two straight days,

The Tadzhik demonstrators are demanding the dissolution of the parliament and the res ignation of an old-style Communist installed as President on Monday.

Tass quoted Lobov as saying the Central Asian decree was "fully in line" with the new Defense Ministry instructions. Soviet troops have long

been used to quash ethnic disputes and independence movements in the republics, often against the wishes of local authorities. Soviet Foreign Minister Bo-

ris Pankin, appealed the West Tuesday for "maximum cooperation" to reconstruct his country's economy.

The White House gave no details immediately of how

Pankin's appeal was received. Bush has promised to supply food and medicine to help the Soviets through the coming winter but so far has ruled out direct US financial help.

The feuding republics of Armenia and Azerbatjan agreed Monday to a cease-fire in ethnic fighting in Nagorno-Karabakh and to limited selfgovernment for the disputed region, news agencies re-

But the deal, reached under the mediation of Russian Federation President Boris N. Yeltsin and Kazakhstan President Nursultan Nazerbayev will require further negotiations, the reported.

The agreement calls for Armenia to relinquish claims it made to the disputed territory in 1989. In return, Azerbaijan which has administered the region for decades, agreed to allow the mostly Armenaian residents of the enclave to choose their own government and run their own affairs, Interfax and the state news agency Tass reported.

A Kazakh legislator who has been on a week-long hunger strike to protest parliamentary procedures in his republic asked for political asylum in the Russian federation Tuesday. Tass reported.

In a letter to Russian Federation President Boris N. Yeltsin, lawmaker Vladimir Chernyshov said that the "leadership of my republic violates laws and it is impossible to do anything the Soviet news

Chernyshov said he began fasting after his protests about the legitimacy of decisions passed at a parliamentary session when there was no quorum went unheeded. Tass said. It did not say what those decisions were about.

There was no immediate response from Yeltsin.

Besides being a lawmaker, Chernyshov is a building foreman from the Kazakh city of Kustani, Tass said.

Leading Soviet reformers said on Monday conservatives were preparing a counter-attack after the failed coup last month and warned the country was facing a catastrophe if radical reforms were not started immediately. Former Foreign Minister Eduard Shevardna dze. Moscow Mayor Gavriil Popov, and leading economist Pavel Bunich, attending a meeting of the Democratic Reform Movement (DRM) called for unity of "democratic forces" in the tailspinning economic crisis.

"Two days ago we [the DRM leadership) came to the conclusion that the country is in economic and political chaos. If extraordinary measures are not taken, we face national catastrophe. " Shevardnadze told reporters.

He recalled that the Movement's leadership had said a coup was imminent just two days before top communist and state officials temporarily ousted President Mikhail Gorbachev.

Floods render 100,000 homeless in Naogaon

By Staff Correspondent Over one lakh people in Naogaon district have been

rendered homeless by flood. When contacted last night district administration sources said that the homeless people have taken shelter in a total of

231 schools and other places. Flood waters have started receding from the Naogaon municipal area, but vast areas of the district were still under water Tuesday.

According to reports available from Naogaon, over nine lakh people in nine upazilas of the district were affected by the floods. The most affected upazilas are - Atrai, Raninagar, Mohadevpur, Patnitala, Manda and Badalgachi.

Over 66,000 dwellings in the affected areas were damaged totally or partly by the floods.

Embankments in Gangazoar, Fatehpur, Khidirpur have been washed away by the onrush of water from the upstream for which new area of Chandipur and Boalia union under Sadar upazila have been inundated.

A number of villages including Chandipur, Khidirpur, Sultanpur, Chakrampur, Pirojpur, Ilshabari, Simulia, Satni, Boalia, Par-Naogaon, Fatehpur, Debipur were badly affected.

ALGIERS, Sept 24: Senior Palestine Liberation Organisa tion officials meeting at the Palestinian parliament in exile expressed growing support today for US plans for a Middle East conference, but called for the enforcement of existing UN resolutions, reports AFP.

Ahmad Abderrahman, justdesignated spokesman of the Palestine National Council (parliament), told journalists early today that the PLO viewed "more and more positively US President George Bush's Middle East peace proposals".

Abderrahman echoed statements Monday by PLO Chair man Yaser Arafat who pledged during the opening of the PNC that his organisation would contribute to the success of plans for a US-Soviet sponsored peace conference.

The PNC, which on Monday made appointments and heard a report on political developments since the last PNC met here in 1988, is set today to debate issues central to the peace process.

Arafat repeated his call for an independent Palestinian state with Jerusalem as its capital.

The United States, which is on record as supporting autonomy for the Palestinians, regards east Jerusalem as occupied territory. Washington wants its status to be decided in negotiations.

It was not immediately clear if Washington has given the Palestinians assurances they sought on the status of Jerusalem. Two Palestinian delegates

France, Belgium send troops to Zaire

KINSHASA, Sept 24: France and Belgium flew hundreds of troops to Zaire today after 30 people were killed in a wild of spree of rioting and looting by mobs led by mutinous soldiers. In Paris, an official source said one French soldier was shot dead and another was wounded when shooting broke out as French troops intervened to help round up some of the 3,500 French residents in the capital Kinshasa. Hundreds of foreign nationals scrambled to flee the sprawling central African country and more than 1,000 people took refuge in the luxury intercontinental hotel in Kinshasa, reports Reuter.

UN gives Iraq deadline to free inspectors

NEW YORK, United Nations, Sept 24: The UN Security Council today gave Iraq a deadline to release all members of the nuclear inspection team detained in Baghdad and issue a written response to the UN demand to fly helicopters over its territory. Council president Jean-Bernar Merimee of France warned Iraqi Ambassador Abdul Amir Al Anbari that his country would have to comply with both demands before the council convened for their next meeting at 5.00 pm (2100 GMT), reports AFP.

UN inspectors accused of spying for Washington

NICOSIA, Sept 24: Iraqi Deputy Prime Minister Tareq Aziz accused UN weapons inspectors held by security forces in central Baghdad today of carrying out espionage for the United States, reports Reuter.
