Exports to Pakistan valued Taka 113.6 crore while imports from there amounted to Taka 161.26 crore with Dhaka's trade imbalance with Islamabad running into Taka 48 crore in 1990-91.

Bangladesh exported goods worth Taka 0.55 lakh to Bhutan while its imports stood at Taka 16.75 crore in 1990-

The trade balances were favourable with Nepal and Sri Lanka. Exports to Sri Lanka stood at Taka 40.39 crore while imports amounted to Taka 18.20 crore. Bangladesh exported goods worth Taka 56.50 crore to Nepal while imports valued Taka 0.48 crore.

He said the small industries can play a vital role in the economic uplistment of the country.
