

## A bad week for boxing



Sept 26 : A pair of fighters in California and Britain were still in comas on Wednesday, four

days after losing title fights in which they received blows to the head that apparently caused blood clots requiring injuries. surgery, reports Reuter.

Bantamweight boxer Fernie Morales, still unconscious on Wednesday and on a life support machine, was in critical but stable condition following brain surgery to remove a blood clot apparently caused by blows sustained in his fight on Saturday in Indio, California, a hospital spokesman said.

Christian Okenefula won the The 25-year-old Morales, a Mexican-born US citizen who lives in Texas, collapsed in a parking lot on Saturday shortly after losing a 12- round decision to International Boxing bantamweight Federation champion Orlando Canizales in Indio, about 140 miles (225 km) east of Los Angeles.

In London, 26-year-old British boxer Michael Watson also was in a coma following two rounds of emergency surgery to remove blood clots from his brain after his defeat in a World Boxing Organisation super-middleweight title fight against compatriot Chris Eubank on Saturday.

Eubank, who won the fight after flooring Watson with a fierce right uppercut followed by a left hook, joined his opponent's family at his hospital bedside. "Michael's mother held my

hand and his uncle told me:"It was not your fault. It could have been you," Eubank told Eubank, who has expressed regret and sorrow over the fight tragedy, said: "The whole family were polite and nice. There was no bitterness or hostility towards me."


Watson suffered severe brain damage from punches in the closing rounds of the bout, a rematch arranged after an earlier contest went to Eubank on a narrow points decision.

The drama of Watson's ringside collapse and the seriousness of his injuries have provoked strong calls in Britain for boxing to be banned, or at least to be subjected to a safety review to assess ways of reducing dangers to fighters.

Doctors said Watson had been heavily sedated to keep his condition stable and help relieve the pressure on his brain, swollen by the beating he endured in the ring.
