

About 7,500 people become victims of snake-bite of whom about 1600 (22 per cent) die every year in the

country, reports BSS. This was found by the Life Science Institute of Jahangirnagar University and the Institute of Public Health in a joint survey

recently. They also found that only seven per cent of the total victims were hospitalised and 90 per cent were sent to the traditional snake-bite physicians popularly known as 'Ojha'.

The survey was conducted in 50 upazilas on the basis of random sampling in accordance with the guideline of Bangladesh Statistical

The report says that almost all incidents were recorded from rural areas and majority of the victims were farmers (38 per cent) and housewives (26 per cent). They were attacked at night Dateline

higher when, due to rainfall the snakes come out of their shelters.

Dwelling at length on the constituted Saturday with background of high death tolls, the survey found that most of the victims following biting came under treatment of the "Ojhas" instead of hospitalisation. This happens due to a common belief in our villages that the snake-bite cases have no modern treatment and that most of the local hospitals have no medicine or anti-venom for

innecessary panic due to lack of knowledge about snakes and snake-bite was also a major reason for the deaths of the victims, the report mentioned. As most of the snakes in our country are non-poisonous (out of 78 species only 26 are poisonous), the 'Ojhas' are able to convince the people that the patients are getting new lives at their treatment who in most of the cases were bitten by nonpoisonous snakes.


