Banks directed to extend
more credit to rural areas

Finance Minister M. Saifur Rahman Monday asked all commercial banks to extend more credit facilities in agriculture and rural industries for reactivating the economy and helping people to improve their lot, reports BSS.

Addressing a meeting of bankers and members of the Chambers of Commerce and Industry, the Finance Minister said there was no dearth of fund but what was needed was to channel those to the good borrowers in rural areas.

State Minister for Finance Mujibur Rahman, Principal Finance Secretary Khorshed Alam and Bangladesh Bank Governor S. B. Chowdhury also addressed the meeting which was attended by the chairman and directors of the nationalised commercial banks, chairmen and chief executives of private banks and chief executives of the foreign banks operating in Bangladesh and representatives of Bangladesh Federation of Chambers of

Commerce and Industry and other chambers.

Rahman said economic activities would be geared up for rehabilitation of the cyclone-affected and flood-affected areas.

He said in a market economy, the financial institutions have a great role to play for boosting economy by providing credit to the people.

The Finance Minister underlined the need for raising the purchasing power of the people in the rural areas. "Unless purchasing capacity is enhanced, neither industrial production will be consumed nor trade will expand," he said.

The Finance Minister said in liberalised and deregulated economic environment, the local industries would have to improve the quality of their productions so that those could effectively compete with import-items instead of asking for tariff protection.

Rahman said in a deregulated economy there was less scope for corrupt practices. In

a free economy transparency was the compelling element in all the sectors including banking transaction, he said.

He said the BNP government was committed to establishing rule of law, ensuring human rights and accountability and transparency in all government activities, which were needed for democracy and economic development of the country.

Dwelling upon the activities of the foreign banks operating in Bangladesh, the Finance Minister said those could not remain oblivious of their social obligation in this country.

He pointed out that their business should not be confined to the 'blue chip' industries and business only.

The Finance Minister invited suggestions from the bankers and members of different chambers for revitalising the economy, particularly stimulating the rural economy of the country.

White paper on DCC
corruption soon

Dhaka City Corporation Mayor Mirza Abbas Monday said a white paper will be published soon on alleged corruption by Administrators of the Corporation during the nine-year autocratic rule, reports BSS.

"They (Administrators) left a debt liability of Taka 138 crore... The white paper will be released by October 30, may be within the next 10 days," he told journalists attending a training course at the Press Institute of Bangladesh (PIB).

The financial loss incurred by the Corporation during the period may be compensated, but the moral degradation in different tiers of the administration is irreparable, Abbas remarked.

The Corporation is facing serious fund constraints due to

financial mismanagement by the Administrators of the autocratic regime, he added.

It needs at least Taka 100 crore to take any long term development programme to extend civil amenities to the city dwellers, the Mayor said.

Work on some development projects have already been started, he said seeking all out cooperation from the people to tackle different problems of the metropolis.

The City Corporation will launch an intensified campaign today to motivate the people to keep the metropolis clean and tidy.

Five senior reporters are taking part in the 10-day training course from September 23 aimed to develop professional skills.
