'But I Don't Have An Uncle'



Sunlight often can't reach the ground, only shadows raid the narrow lane where two rickshaws can hardly pass. It's like hundreds of other lanes in Dhaka with a lot of incomplete buildings and overburdened with a huge population, but with a little difference. Named 'Garam Panir Golf' which means 'Hot Water, Lane' - it is now quite a matured place with a large population most of whom are bachelors struggling hard to maintain or even find a source of income to support their respective families. No one particularly remembers how this funny name developed or what its previous name was, except a few oldtimers who belong to this locality.

Located beside one of Dhaka's most populous and busicst places, Motifheel Commercial Area, the heart of Bangladesh, the Hot Water Lane's most inhabitants are somehow involved with this business centre. A large number of them are employed in many private business organisations, banks, insurance companies etc. Among the inhabitants of this tiny lane, most began their working life staying in this lane, a life full of struggle. These people, after completion of their education, join other bachelors in the mess, where they share a room and eat from the same cook.

A seat in these messes easts only Tk 250 to 500 with different conditions. The food charge can be limited within Tk 600 to 750. So, the monthly cost of living varies from Tk 900 to 1200. A lot of inhabitants carn a monthly package of Tk 2000 to 3000. Some of these people save some money from this and send to their parents, who by love and sorrow, provided the cost of education often by selling their valuable land.


