# Tyson says he'll stop Holyfield

certainly less exciting, former heavyweight champion Mike Tyson said on Wednesday he wants to win back the title and would stop undisputed champion Evander Holyfield next month, reports Reuter.

The questions asked of Tyson — in Las Vegas where training for the November 8 title fight — made a presidential news conference seem like a venture into stream of consciousness.

For example, all questions from reporters attending the live closed-circuit televised conference, for which Tyson appeared 45 minutes late, had to be submitted ahead of time. No spontaneous questions were allowed.

Then there was a serious-

looking warning flashed on the against Canadian Donovan screen, saying that Tyson's lawyers had told him not to answer any questions about his Tyson, who beat Ruddock

The questions allowed included such incisive probes as how much does it mean to you to win back the title.

The 25-year-old fighter has been indicted on charges that he raped a beauty pageant contestant this past summer in Indianapolis. If Tyson, who says he is innocent, is convicted on all charges, he could draw 63 years in prison. The trial is set to begin early next

It appears that the usually boastful and often crude Tyson is under orders from his lawyers to be very measure and mild in his public appearances in an effort to improve his im-

His demeanour was in stark contrast to news conferences promoting Tyson's two fights

That provided a sharp contrast between Tyson's training methods and those of the 28year-old Holyfield, which include exhaustive analysis of his opponents' tendencies.

"Is there anything that you arc concerned with about Holyfield's training?" "No, not at all," said the

41-1 Tyson. Asked if he was the same fighter who knocked out

Michael Spinks in 91 seconds in 1988, Tyson said: "I'm better. I'm a more mature fighter. I'm more patient. Don King, Tyson's promoter

Holyfield how much punishment he wants to take.' King said that Holyfield,
