Razzak Ali may be elected Speaker unopposed: AL to contest for the post of Deputy Speaker

International JS session opens today amid political acrimony

Sheikh Razzak Ali, Deputy Speaker of the Jatiya Sangsad (parliament) is expected to be elected Speaker after the House goes into its third session today at 4 pm.

The Constitution provides that if the post of either the Speaker or the Deputy Speaker becomes vacant, the vacancy shall be filled within seven days if the parliament is in session, or at its first meeting thereafter.

If Deputy Speaker Sheikh Razzak Ali is elected Speaker, election to the post of Deputy Speaker will be held tomorrow or the day after. Elections to both the posts cannot be held on one day because techni-

cally only one post is vacant. Immediately after the opening of the session with Deputy Speaker Sheikh Razzak Ali in the chair, a panel of chairmen will be nominated and the election to the post of Speaker will be conducted by one of the members of the panel.

The post of Speaker fell vacant on September 25 when former Speaker Abdur Rahman Biswas resigned before submitting his nomination for election to the office of President.

The session is likely to be stormy, because big opposition parties, Awami League and Jatiya Party, are having a strained relationship with the ruling Bangladesh Nationalist

Party (BNP). The Awami League will take up the issue of passage of the Indemnity Repeal Bill submitby Mohammad Nasim, Chief Whip of the Opposition and launch a frontal attack on the treasury bench for its alleged reluctance to institute an inquiry into a reported conspiracy to assassinate Sheikh Hasina and its failure to check campus violence. The Jatiya Party will try to mount pressure for the release of deposed president H M Ershad convicted in an arms case.

As regards the election of the Deputy Speaker, the government and the opposition parties are yet to come to terms. It is gathered that the largest opposition party in parliament, Awami League, will not field any candidate against Sheikh Razzak Ali if the latter contests for the post of Speaker.

However, AL may not allow the election of the Deputy Speaker to go unchallenged, if the move to have a consensus candidate fails. In that case, AL's possible nominees are Sudhangsu Shekhar Haldar or Col (retd) Shawkat Ali, according to reliable sources.


