

LONDON, Oct 11 The Interna tional Cricket Council (ICC) is to hold a special meeting in Sharjah on October 23

to decide whether South Africans can play in next year's World Cup, reports Reuter.

Sharjah has been chosen as the venue because representatives of West Indies, Pakistan, India and Sri Lanka will be in the United Arab Emirates for a limited overs tournament from October 17 to 25.

The need for a special meeting became unavoidable once the three Asian countries and West Indies made it clear they would not accept a untlateral decision from ICC chairman Colin Cowdrey.

Windies will play even if SA take part in World Cup BRIDGETOWN, Barbados,

Oct 11: The West Indies Cricket Board of Control (WICBC) said on Thursday that it would play in the 1992 World Cup in Australia and New Zealand even if South Africa took part, reports Reuter.

The International Cricket Council (ICC) was to have announced in London on Friday whether South Africa would be allowed into the World Cup, but the decision has been postponed.

WICBC secretary Steve Camacho told Reuters: "If the ICC members vote in faviour of it, the West Indies will participate even though South Africa will also play."

"The ICC is a democratic institution, and the will of the majority will prevail," he added.

Camacho said the West Indies would play in the Cup even though "we are holding to the stand taken at our recent board meeting that South

Africa should not be allowed to

take part." The West Indies abstained in July when the ICC voted to re-admit South Africa after a 20-year ban.
