JERUSALEM, Oct 18: The United States and Soviet Union today invited Arabs and Jews to a peace conference in Madrid on October 30 in a historic breakthrough in Middle East diplomacy, reports Reuter.

Prime Minister Yitzhak Shamir said he would recommend to his cabinet that Israel attend. Arab states and Palestinians had already said they would take part.

US Secretary of State James Baker, who has been trying since the Gulf war to bring together Israel and its Arab encmies, told a joint news conference in Jerusalem with Soviet Foreign Minister Boris Pankin, "that conference is to be followed by direct negotiations designed to achieve real peace.

US President George Bush will open the Middle East peace conference which will also be attended by Soviet President Mikhail Gorbachev.

The White House said US and Soviet ambassadors in the Middle East would jointly deliver the invitations and Bush "very much hopes all those invited will respond quickly and affirmatively Israel delayed a final answer
