NBR move to amend Gift Tax Act opposed

Bangladesh Tax Lawyers' Association on Friday slated the recent steps taken by the National Board of Revenue to re-evaluate the already settled cases of income tax under Gift Tax Act of 1990 and called for the withdrawal of such a step.

Terming the step as being devoid of morality to harass the tax-payers, the President of the Association, Shamsur Rahman and Secretary General M.A. Salam Talukdar in a statement said that it has caused deep concern to the tax-payers.

The move by NBR, the statement said it is designed to show the invested cash-gifts as 'cash credit' and tax it as part of the income by disregarding a number of the tax appeal court verdicts and despite all, existing legal conditions having been fulfilled.

Such a step is against the existing laws of the country and it is even contrary to the decisions of the NBR, as a proposal to end the receipting of cash-gifts was rejected at the ninth and tenth meeting of NBR on the National Budget, the statement pointed out.

Such a step will further weaken the already weak investment climate in the country, the statement noted.

Media men urged to play role in health education

Deputy Leader of the Jatiya Sangsad Prof AQM Bdrudhoza Chowdhury Friday urged the media men to play their due role in reaching the health education to the common masses, reports BSS.

Delivering his presidential speech at a discussion on 'The role of mass media in spreading health education' at the auditorium of the Management Development Centre at Sobhanbag in Dhaka, Prof Chowdhury said, 'Health for all by the year 2000' could not be ensured without creating awareness of hygiene among each citizen of the country.'

The discussion was held on the occasion of the five years of publication of the health magazine 'Apar Shastha' (Your Health). It was attended by Deputy Minister for Health and Family Welfare Sirajul Haq as the chief guest.

Prof S A Khaleque, Editor of the Monthly, gave the address of welcome, while national Professor, Dr. Nurul Islam, Dr. Shamsur Ali of Dhaka University, Dr. Syed Modasser Ali of IPGMR and Mobarak Hossain Khan, Director, Radio Bangladesh (External Service), among others, took part in the discussions.

Prof. Chowdhury regretted that a large number of magazines were available in the market which contain cheap amusement but weeklies or monthlies on health can hardly

be found. Stressing the need for spreading health education by both electronic and printing media, Prof Chowdhury said preventive measures on health should be projected adequately.

Prof S A Khaleque urged the government to take more effective steps to spread the health education for improvement of the people's health.

ICDDR, B scientific confce from Oct 26

The International Centre for Diarrhoeal Diseases and Research, Bangladesh (ICDDR, B) will hold its first scientific conference from October 26 aimed at disseminating its past and recent research findings among professionals, medical educators and policy makers in the country, reports UNB.

The three-day conference, to be held at the auditorium of Bangladesh College of Physicians and Surgeons in Mohakhali in the city, will be attended by researchers, professionals, planners and representatives from the media.

Major topics to be discussed at the conference include diarrhoeal diseases, maternal and child health, nutrition and population and family planning.

3 die after eating Potka fish

Three minors of a family died and six others fell sick Friday after taking 'Potka' fish at Shatamandi village in Araihajar upazila of Narayanganj district, hospital sources said, reports UNB.

Hashem (5) and Kdhem (7) breathed their last at Araihajar Hospital and Yasmin (2) at Dhaka Medical College Hospital.

Rahatun (30), Banidha (65), Aziz (10), Abdul Kader (21) and Khaibun (70) were under treatment in Dhaka Medical College Hospital. Relatives of the victims said, they fell sick after taking 'Potka' fish bought from the local market.

No famine-like situation in Rangpur: Minister

Massive post-flood relief work is in full swing in all the affected areas of Rangpur district to mitigate the sufferings of the people.

According to official sources in Dhaka, the civil administration and army personnel are continuing their relief work after the recession of floods from affected areas of the district.

All possible measures have been taken by the administration to minimise the suffering by providing relief materials among the people with the objective that none should die of starvation, they said.

The State Minister for Land, Kabir Hossain, told BSS that government is providing relief, including wheat and others.

Deputy Commissioner, Rangpur, Giasuddin Ahmed said the situation was under control and the administration has so far distributed 898 tonnes of rice, 620 tonnes of wheat and Taka 825,000 among the distressed people. Besides Taka 750,000 had been distributed among the affected people as house building grant and 4,3845 VOD ration cards had been issued.

Meanwhile work on 126 test relief projects are going on in the district and 27 test relief projects had been completed.

The programme has been taken with the objective of providing job opportunities among the distressed people for generating employment.

The district administration sources told BSS that relief goods are being distributed 'systematically' and no report of corruption has been received from anywhere.

Rangpur district's itself a food deficit area and the recent flood and erosion have caused colossal damage to standing crops and dwelling houses in the district, official sources said.

Muslim League

Forest employees to go on indefinite strike from Nov 12

RANGAMATI, Oct 18: The Bangladesh Bon Karmo Nirbahi Samity (BBKNS) has decided to go for complete work shut down on November 12 for realisation of their 10 point demands, reports UNB.

The demands include, changes in the recruitment policy and reorganisation of service, filling up the vacant posts of forest officials through promotion, reinstatement of officials who had been dismissed without valid reasons and payment of salary undistributed for the last four months.

The BBKNS Chairman Wazuddin said here, the action programme would begin on Oct 26 with all employees of the forest directorate putting on black badges, which will continue until November 2. The employees will stage sit-in at the front doors of Divisional Forest offices on November 11 and start an indefinite strike on November 12.

They will gherao the Banabhaban at Mohakhali, Dhaka, on November 18 and

hold a token hunger strike followed by a rally on November 19 in front of the National Press Club.

Another report adds: The tribal students of the district held a demonstration here protesting discontinuation of financial grant to two tribal students' hostels at Bandarban and Ali-Kadam.

The students took out a procession which paraded the main through lanes of the town demanding an end to the uncertainty on the status of the two hostels.

After the procession, a rally was held at Chowmahini in front of the Bandarban Shishu Academy on Oct 12 in which the students' leader K S Mong threatened to launch a vigorous action programme if the matter was not solved immediately.

They submitted a memorandum to the Deputy Commissioner (DC) Ataur Rahman Majumder who said the case had been referred to the higher authorities for decision. The Chittagong Hill Tracts

Development Board had established four hostels for the tribal students five years ago at Rangamati, Khagrachhari, Bandarban and Ali-Kadam. Two of the hostels at Rangamati and Khagrachhari had been taken over by the district administration on the expiry of five years. But the two others at Bandarban and Ali-Kadam had been left out and as a result their financial grant also ceased.

The fate of 150 resident students of these two hostels have therefore become uncertain, local people said.

UNB further adds: An outlawed Shantibahini member Rabin Chakma of Borkal upazila surrendered Sunday to the law enforcing agency at Bandarban with two rifles and few ammunition, official sources said. Robin told the officials he decided to surrender after being disillusioned with the outlawed Shantibahini, which had been committing atrocities on innocent people.

Robin had joined the Shantibahini in 1985.
