### Bid to curb stealing satellite signals

SYDNEY, Oct 19: The world's leading sporting federations say they have agreed joint action to stamp out piracy by television networks of major sporting events, reports

The decision was announced by a spokesman for the General Association of International Sports Federations (GAISF) which represents 75 Olympic and non-Olympic sports organisa-

The Association has asked members to report any evidence of illegal stealing of satellite signals, according to general secretary Luc Niggli on

GAISF, had already received evidence in a number of cases, the most recent during the Athletics World Championships in Tokyo where a number of television stations stole the signal for Carl Lewis's record 100 me-

"I will not give any names but there are several legal broadcasters who are pirating signals. It's happening in Europe," Niggli told Reuters

during GAISF's annual congress.

At last year's general assembly, GAISF agreed to launch a campaign against piracy which has been made easier by the development of satellite and cable networks.


