the-match. Richardson and Jeff Dujon put on 154 for the sixth wicket which carried the West Indies to within 26 runs of victory with six overs still togo.

But Richardson, whose unbeaten 106 had stunned Pakistan in their first meeting last Thursday, was dismissed through a fine catch by Ijaz Ahmed on the square leg boundary off Younis in the 44th over to bring Pakistan roaring back into the match.

Richardson hit seven boundaries and three sixes in a superb 121-ball innings and Duton made 53.

But Younis and Wasim Akram stopped the remaining West indian batsmen in their tracks.

Just 16 runs came between the 45th and 49th overs till Bishop's big hitting in the final over set up the exciting finish.

Pakistan's innings revolved around a 137-run third wicket stand between skipper Imran Khan and Rameez Raja. Imran scored 77 while Raja con-
