BSS adds: The Ministry of Home Affairs in a press note yesterday said: " A group of 80/90 Chhatra League workers under the leadership Chittagong District (North) Chhatra League Secretary Debashish launched an attack on the Chhatra Dal at Bangladesh Institute of Technology (BTI) at Raozan and opened indiscriminate fire and hurled bombs at 2.30 on the night of October 23, 1991 The local administration and police took preparations to thwart the attack after receiving secret information. Police fired five blank shots during

the incident and arrested seven persons including Chhatra League leader Debashish. Of the arrested persons, three are students of BTI and the four others are outsiders. A pipe gun, a Chinese axe and some bullets were recovered from the arrested persons. A case has been filed with Raozan thana in this connection.

A delegation of teachers and employees headed by the BTI Director met the Divisional Commissioner at 2 pm on October 24, 1991 and placed a demand to keep the institution free from terrorism.

The Divisional Commissioner, iterating the government's determination to quell terrorism, assured them of all-out administrative measures to check campus violence. The Divisional Commissigner called upon the teachers not to encourage terrorism on the campus.

DAMASCUS, Oct 24: Arab states pledged today to maintain a common stand at all stages of their historic Middle East peace talks with Israel and called for an immediate halt to Israeli settlement in the occupied territories, report agencies.

Arab, foreign ministers. winding up a two days of consultations in Damascus. mapped out their main aims and agreed to hold further meetings to review talks held by any of the Arab delegations with Israel at next week's Madrid peace conference or

sure Israeli withdrawal from all occupied Arab territories, including Jerusalem; to halt Israeli settlement immediately and to ensure the legitimate national rights of the Palestinian people," the ministers said in a statement.

Syrian Foreign Minister Faroug Al-Shara, whose country is Israel's most resolute Arab foe, read the statement to reporters.

Coordination is vital for the Arabs recause the main delegations at the Madrid conference, which opens on Wednesday, will face Israeli

negotiators separately on the key issues - peace and bor-The Palestine Liberation

Organisation, which is barred from attending the talks, is specially anxious to ensure that Israel does not make separate deals with any of its Arab neighbours while stonewalling on the central question - the future of Jerusalem, the West Bank and the Gaza Strip. Sixteen Arab states were represented directly or indirectly at the Damascus meeting. They included all those that will go to Madrid plus the PLO, which will play a backstage role in di-

recting Palestinians attending the conference in a joint delegation with Jordan.

The talks began with a meeting between the PLO, to which Israel refuses to talk. and the four Arab countries which border the Jewish state. They were joined on Wednesday evening by the Foreign Ministers of Saudi Arabia and Morocco representing six Gulf and five North African states.

The statement did not make clear whether the other Arab participants would go along with Syria's wish to delay multilateral talks on secondary and water rights, until Israel yielded on the central question

Syria is demanding return of the Golam Heights seized in the 1967 Middle East war along with Arab. East Jerusalem, the West Bank and the Gaza Strip.

There was no reference to a prepeace conference summit meeting, which Syria and the PLO sought last weekend.

#### NBR has power to re-examine doubtful income

The National Board of Revenue (NBR) said on Thursday that it had the power to re-examine the cases, of income tax which had created doubt in a clarification to reports

published in a section of the press. NBR said, it was witnessed that fixation of income tax was not made in a lawful manger and a huge sum of money was turned into capital on self-fixation basis or by taking advantage of the Gift Tax Act. These cases will be re-examined but no steps will be taken without proper scrutiny. NBR said.

In amending the Tax Act, NBR was not imposing retrospective effect and reopening the settled cases, the clarification said. On the complaints of ignor-

ing the verdicts of the Taxes Appellate Tribunal, NBR said appeals could be lodged with the Supreme Court Appellate Division against the verdicts of the Taxes Appellate Tribunal and High Court Division of the Supreme Court. Even the verdict of the Supreme Court Appellate Division can be placed for 'review' of the Supreme Court by the Taxes Department. This does not suggest that the court verdicts were dishonoured, NBR main-
