

Diarrhoea spreads to 30 dists

Diarrhoea continues to spread unabated and 30 districts have already come under its attack. Official sources said last

night that since September 1. a total of 1,47.265 people have been attacked with the disease and 2100 of them died so far. However, unofficial sources

said the number of diarrhoea victims would be much higher. since all the cases, particularly from remote areas, were not reported to authorities. According to the unofficial estimate over five thousand people died of this disease while several lakhs were attacked.

When contacted, officials of the Health Ministry said that the outbreak of diarrhoea at this time was a seasonal inci-

dence every year. But this time it is much more severe mainly because of the effect of the flood. Scarcity of drinking water coupled with malnutrition has aggravated the situation. However, the officials hope that the situation would be controlled within a couple of weeks.

But experts say that the scarcity of drinking water is not the only reason which has been causing diarrhoea for the last two months. According to them, intake of sub-standard food is causing spread of the disease, particularly in the northern districts where millions were badly affected by the recent flood.

*Only medicine and saline cannot improve the diarrhoea

situation unless adequate food and succour are arranged for the affected people," said an

According to government sources, spread of diarrhoea was reported from different upazilas of Sylhet district Friday, which raised the number of affected districts to 30. Besides in the 16 districts of Rajshahi division, the disease has broken out in Magura. Manikgani, Jamalpur, Tangail, Netrokona, Kishoreganj, Sunamganj, Mymensingh, Habigani, Sherpur, Chandpur, Maulvibazar and Kushtia.

Another 4281 people were attacked in these districts in 24 hours till Friday morning while 26 persons died during the period. Highest death of

four occurred in Sherpur.

Nilphamary is the worst affected by diarrhoea where, according to official estimate 217 people died in 56 days. But, other sources claim that the death toll in the district has already crossed 1000. In Pabna, 138 deaths have been

officially recorded. Reports reaching from Sylhet says that the disease broke out in different areas of the Sadar. Companyganj. Goainghat and Zakiganj upazilas. Diarrhoea also spread to the Sadar upazila and Jagannathpur in Sunamganj district.

Anti-brothel campaigners call hartal after clash with police

From Our Correspondent NARAYANGANJ, Oct 25: At least 20 people, including three policemen, were injured when clashes broke out between the anti-brothel processionists and the police here this afternoon.

Police arrested 18 persons. including an ex-commissioner of the local paurasava, during the clashes. The Unislamic Activities Resistance Committee (UARC), which organised the anti-brothel programme called a day-long hartal in the town on October 31 to protest the police action and the arrests.

During the hours-long police resorted to lathi-charge as the processionists started pelting stones at them, damaged motor vehicles and shops.

Over five thousand registered prostitutes of the Tanbazar, and Tantibazar brothels have become uncertain about their fate since the UARC threatened to evict them from the area. Besides, all the shops, including that of liquour and drugs around the brothels have remained closed.

The prostitutes are now in acute economic hardship since no clients turned up during the last few days.

Mobutu's villa set on fire

BRAZZAVILLE, Oct 25: Zairean protesters looted and set ablaze a villa of President Mobutu Sese Seko and pillaged the home of his new Prime Minister in Kinshasa, witnesses said Friday, reports AP.

Belgium and France were evacuating their citizens and troops from Zaire. Belgium Foreign Minister Mark Eyskens said, "It is apparent that there is much unrest within the army as the nation is sliding into a situation which is apparently uncontrollable and was unclear whether Mobutu had lost control of the army or. as the opposition charges. wanted the situation to deteriorate into chaos as an

excuse to impose a military

government, as he did on seizing power when he was army commander in 1965.

The latest unrest in the capital is to protest Mobutu's firing of opposition leader Etienne Tshisekedi as prime minister. Mobutu replaced Tshisekedi with Bernardin Mungul-Diaka, a minor opposition leader branded a traitor by his colleagues.

Belgium, former colonial ruler of Zaire, and France had pressured Mobutu to share power with Tshisekedi and move toward democracy.

Belgium, France and the United States installed Mobutu helped keep him in power as a bastion against communism during the Cold War despite

charges of gross corruption and brutal suppression. However, since the collapse of communism, they have shifted their support to the opposi-

Friday. France announced it was suspending cooperation agreements with Zaire and evacuating all of its aid work-France also announced it

was withdrawing 150 paratroopers from the capital, the last of a contingent of nearly 1,000 and ordered its citizens out. French and Belgian troops, who entered Zaire last month to protect foreigners during the first wave of riots and pillaging, were seen by many as the last stabilising force in the troubled nation.

France also said it would close its consulate in the mining capital of Lubumbashi. flashpoints of the latest violence, as soon as the evacuation is complete. The United States is considering closing its consulate in Lubumbashi as well. France says it will reduce its diplomatic staff in Kinshasa to a minimum after that city's evacuation is complete.

France has 600-700 citizens remaining in Zaire. The United States has told the 400 remaining Americans to get out, saying it was irresponsible
