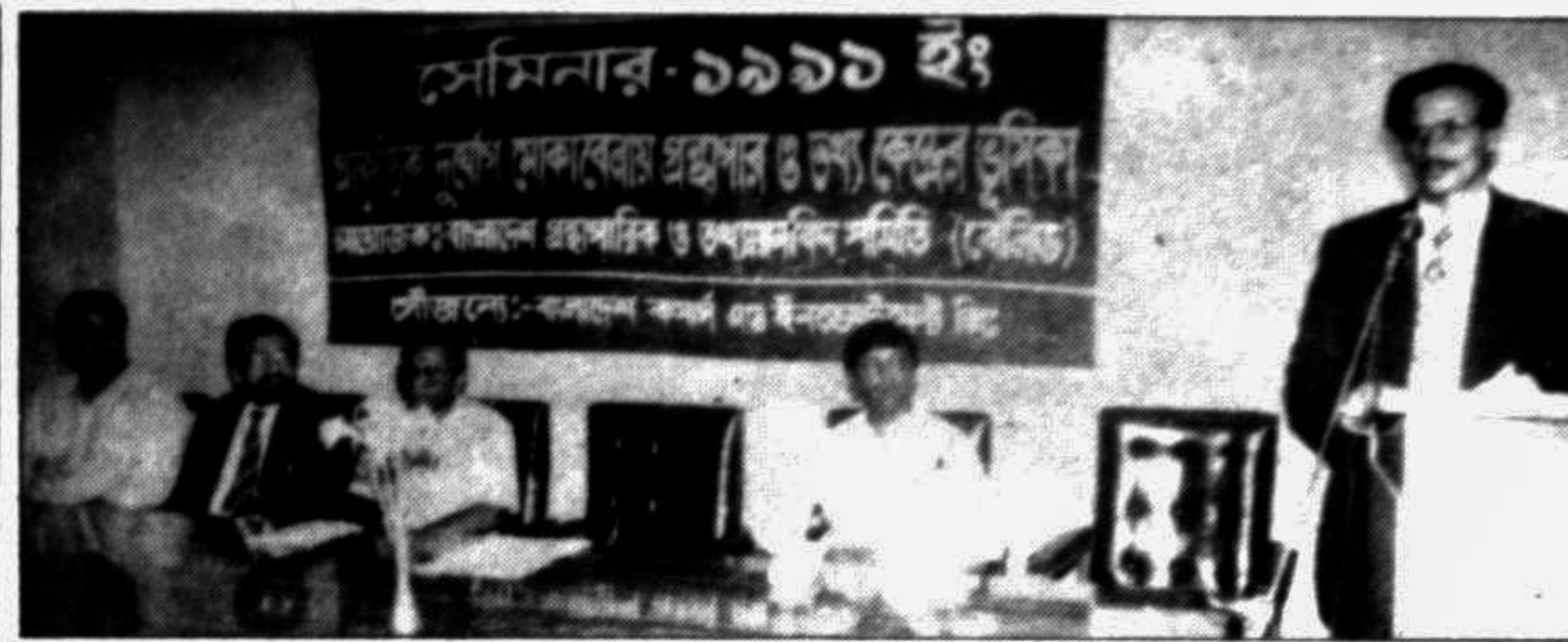

A released/retired Non-Commissioned Armed Forces personnel will get the benefit of age relaxation for Government jobs upto a maximum period the person has actually served the armed forces subject to the condition that a released/retired Non-Commissioned Armed Forces personnel who has attained the age of superannuation will not be eligible for recruitment to civil posts.
3. Ad-hoc appointees (if any) against the posts will be eligible to apply only if at the time of entry into services as ad-hoc appointees they were within the prescribed age limits and had the requisite qualification according to the recruitment rules.
4. **'Better library services a must to face disasters'**

State Minister for Education Principal Md Eunus Khan Monday underlined the role of library and librarians in the management of natural disasters, reports BSS.

He said in spite of huge loss caused by natural disasters, there was a very little progress in effective management of disasters throughout the world due to lack of correct information and poor library services.

The State Minister was speaking as the chief guest at a seminar on "Role of library and information centres in facing natural disasters" held in Dhaka in the afternoon.

Presided over by S M Mannan, President of Bangladesh Association of Librarians, Information Scientists and Documentalists (BALID), Director General of Secondary and Higher Education Dr Mozammel Haq and renowned journalist Gias Kamal Chowdhury also spoke on the occasion.

**'Disaster preparedness can lessen effects'**

Health and Family Welfare Minister Chowdhury Kamal ibne Yusuf Monday said the government has decided to give maximum attention towards system development for disaster management through existing infrastructure, reports BSS.

The Health Minister was speaking as the Chief guest at the inaugural session of a four day workshop on "Lessons learnt during cyclone -April, 1991."

Presided over by Health Secretary M Mokammel Haque, the session was also addressed by Deputy Minister for Health and Family Welfare M Strajul Haque, World Health Organisation (WHO) Representative in Bangladesh Dr A N A Abeysondere, Additional Secretary Dr K M Fariduddin, Director General of Health Services Prof M A T Siddique.

Chowdhury Kamal Yusuf said, though disasters cannot be stopped their effects would be minimised by disaster management with development

activities and adequate attention to activities relating to disaster preparedness.

Referring to the post-flood situation in the northern districts, the Health Minister said the government has mobilised more than 2,000 medical teams with sufficient logistics and materials to meet the present challenges of disaster and diseases. A significant number of deaths have been averted through round the clock surveillance, care of the sick and with all necessary measures.

The Deputy Minister for Health Strajul Haque said the cyclone of April 1991 was the worst one. He said tidal-bore affected 18 districts, 81 upazilas and six municipalities. A total number 1,38,849 injuries and 1,40,000 deaths were reported from the affected areas. The government machinery including army, navy and air force were fully engaged in relief and rescue work. The present government tried its best to minimize the human sufferings and loss of lives.

**20m tons foodgrains required to feed 11 crore people**

A day-long seminar-cum-workshop on "Biological nitrogen fixation associated with rice" was held in Dhaka Monday at Alliance Francaise, reports BSS.

The Minister for Agriculture, Irrigation, Water Development and Flood Control M Majid-Ul-Haq inaugurated the seminar-cum-workshop, organised by the Centre for Scientific and Technological Information (CESTI) of Embassy of France.

The inaugural function, presided over by Dr S M A Faiz, Dean of the Faculty of Biological Science of the Dhaka University, was also addressed by the Scientific Coordinator of the seminar-cum-workshop, Dr Mustafizur Rahman, Director of the Alliance Francaise, Andre Raynouard, and Scientific Collaborator of the CESTI, Dr Rifat Rashid.

The Agriculture Minister in his inaugural speech, called upon the scientists to put in their best efforts for selecting appropriate technology for boosting agricultural output and reach the best method of production to the door-step of farmers to make the country self-sufficient in food.

The Minister said Bangladesh is a developing country, almost over-burdened with a vast population, the density of which is more than 1566 per square miles, the highest in the world.

He said, "now we are facing

the challenge of feeding such a vast population." He said in 1972, the country could produce only nine million tons of foodgrains and in 1991, the food production had been increased to about 18 million tons which can not achieve self-sufficiency in food, he regretted.

He said at present 20 million tons of foodgrains were required to feed the people, which could only be achieved through coordinated and concerted efforts of agricultural scientists, extension workers and the farmers.

Haq said, "Chemical fertilizers and pesticides had been creating adverse impact in our environment and so he added we have to be very cautious in selecting and adopting correct and appropriate fertilizers and pesticides."

"We are to maintain ecological balance for keeping the world habitable for present as well as the future generations, he said.

He advised the scientists to evolve and adopt appropriate technology to be useful in improving the living standard of the people.

**Steps taken to develop Barind area**

RAJSHAHI, Oct 28 : The 20th meeting of Implementation Co-ordination Committee for "Barind Integrated Area Development Project" was held here recently at Rajshahi Divisional Commissioner's conference room, an official source said Monday, reports BSS.

Presided over by Rajshahi Divisional Commissioner and President, Implementation Co-ordination Committee, N A Habibullah, the meeting was attended by all Deputy Commissioners, Upazila Chairmen, UNOs and departmental heads under the project area.

Removal of present dead-lock in the project, problem of implementation of flood rehabilitation programme and elimination of hindrance in respect of conservation of trees, use of deep tube-well and electrification of irrigation

tools were discussed in detail in the meeting.

The following decisions were taken in the meeting: Conservation of planted trees will be under taken in test relief programme. This will save huge amount of money.

It was recommended for implementation of the scheme of pond re-excavation under food for work programme. All out efforts will have to be taken to bring back the deep tube-wells of the project to utilisation in order to overcome the losses caused by flood and comprehensive programme will have to be adopted to compensate for flood damages. P D B and R E B take measures to electrify the deep tube-wells where electric line and transformer have been set up in order to increase the irrigation area and lessen irrigation cost.

**150 tribal refugees back home**

CHITTAGONG, Oct 28: One hundred and fifty tribal refugees returned home in the district Saturday from different refugee camps in the Indian state of Tripura, reports UNB.

They were forced to leave the country by the outlawed Shantibahini and confined in Korbuk, Lebachari and Thakumbari refugee camps in Tripura, said Samiran Dewan, the Chairman of Khagrachhari hill district Local Government Parishad.

After passing sub-human life for months together, they fled the camps escaping strict surveillance of tribal insurgents and Indian Border Security Force.

The returnees have given all-out assistance and they would be rehabilitated in their original home at Ramgarh and

Mattiranga upazilas, Samiran said.

**Tributes to Helaly**

Speakers at a memorial meeting here Sunday night paid tributes to late Maulana Ismail Helaly for his commendable literary works and his active participation in anti-British movement in the then India.
