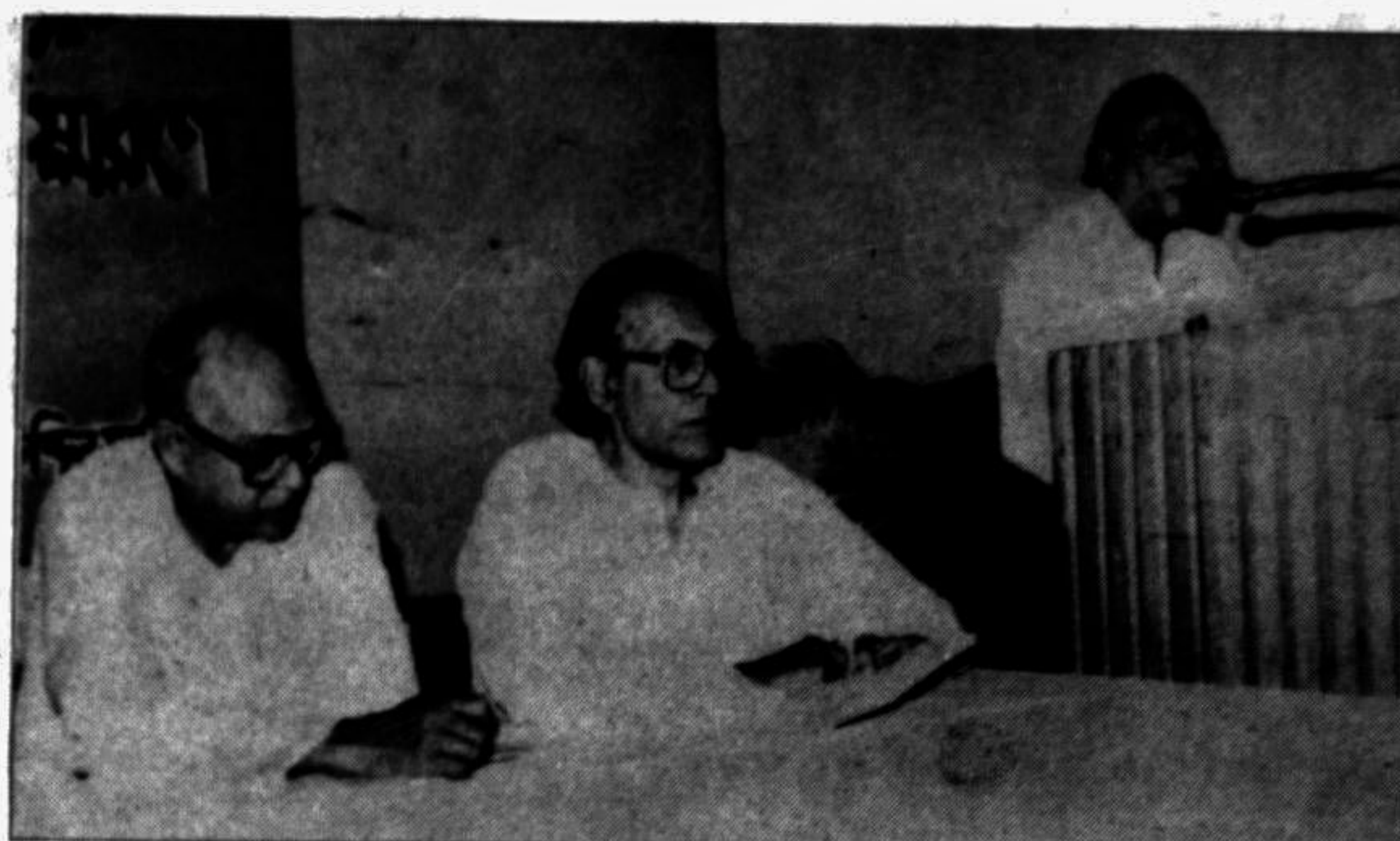
Tributes paid to Tajuddin

The first memorial speech organised by 'Tajuddin Smriti Sangsad' was delivered in Dhaka Tuesday at the National Press Club, reports BSS.

In his speech, Prof Borhanuddin Khan Jahangir of Dhaka University, paid tributes to late Tajuddin Ahmed, the first Prime Minister of Bangladesh provisional government, who was killed in Dhaka Central Jail in 1975. Tajuddin Ahmed was later the Minister of Finance in the cabinet of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman soon after independence.

Speaking on the theme of this year's speech "The Nationalist Movement of Bangladesh," Prof Jahangir dwelt on the flourishing of Bengali nationalist movement in different phases and its culmination in the War of Liberation in 1971. He also paid tributes to late Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman, who led the nationalist movement.

The function was presided over by Dr Khan Sarwar Murshed, a former Vice Chancellor and ex-Ambassador.

Water, Power engns threaten to go on strike from Jan 1

The members of Bangladesh Water and Power Development Board Engineers Association (BWPDEBA) threatened to go on an indefinite strike from January 1 to realise their 13-point charter of demands.

The demands include mainly appointment of an engineer of WDB in place of a PSC officer, filling up of all the vacant posts of engineers, withdrawal of ban on promotion to the post of executive engineer and cancellation of service rules prepared duly by the autocratic regime.

President of the Association, Q M Khalid in a Press conference held at the National Press Club Tuesday said that they had announced this programme as the authorities did not pay heed to their demands.

"We met several times with the authorities in the past and they verbally accepted our demands as legitimate but officially they did yet to our demands," he said adding that "we are giving the government two months time to resolve the matter."

Khalid said that the emergency services would not be exempted during the strike and normal lives would virtually be collapsed if some 2,300 engineers have to go on strike.

Reazul Hassan, Mizanur Rahman and Jaluddin Abdul Hye, among others, were present at the conference.

Cultural accord with Italy signed

A cultural co-operation agreement between Bangladesh and Italy was signed to strengthen existing friendly relations between the two countries and develop co-operation in the cultural field, an official handout said in Dhaka Tuesday, reports BSS.

During the recent visit to Italy, Foreign Minister A S M Mostafizur Rahman and his Italian counterpart Gianni De Michelis signed the agreement on behalf of their respective governments.

The wards of the martyrs of Liberation War Tuesday placed 19-point demand before the government for alleviation of their hardship, reports UNB.

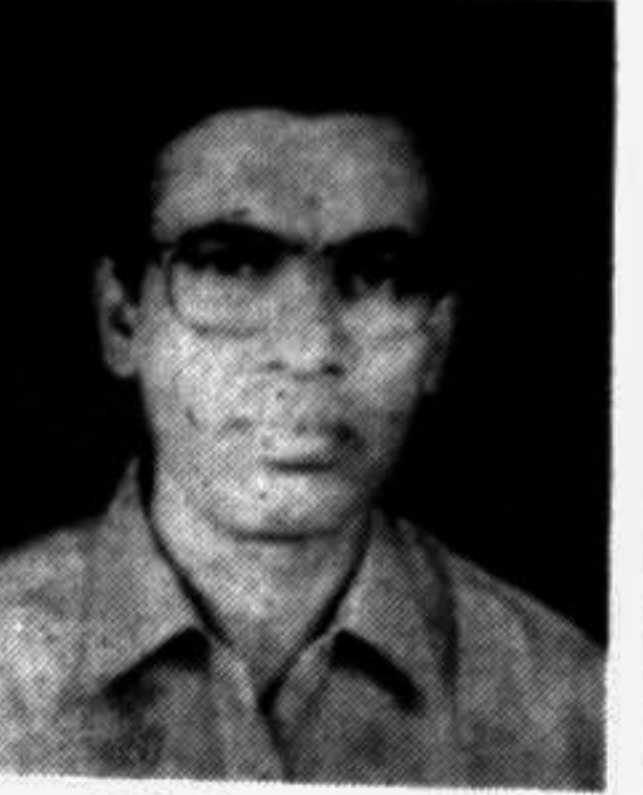

13 Shantibahini men surrender

CHITTAGONG, Oct 29: Thirteen insurgents of outlawed Shantibahini have surrendered to local security forces in Rangamati and Khagrachhari hill districts after declaration of general amnesty on October 22, reports UNB.

Official sources said, 11 Shantibahini activists have surrendered at Almachhara in Barkal upazila of Rangamati district on Thursday with 11 home made guns.

They are: Anil Kumar Chakma, Bimalchwar Chakma, Daya Mohan Chakma, Kali Kumar Chakma, Luxmikumar Chakma, Dabana Chakma, Lakhya Chakma, Kala Choga Chakma, Amal Jiban Chakma, Bira Kumar Chakma and Rasik Kumar Chakma.

Another activist Mong She Pruc Marna surrendered with 3 kg explosives on the same day at Tanchangya Para of Sadar upazila.

In Khagrachhari, Prabhat Kumar Chakma has surrendered with two mortar shells.

They said most of the Shantibahini activists now are willing to come back and restore normal life after the declaration of general amnesty by the government.

60 more refugees back home

About 60 tribal refugees have returned in Khagrachhari Sunday from the different refugee camps in south Tripura state of India.

With this the total figure during the last three days stood at 210, official sources said.

Chairman of Local Government Parishad of Khagrachhari hill district, Samiran Dewan told UNB that cash Tk 1500 has been distributed to each family of the returnees adding that each family will get 21 kg foodgrains per week until their final rehabilitation.

Call to solve jute workers' problems

Bangladesh Stramik Kalyan Federation-Chittagong division President M A Taher and General Secretary Iqbal Khan Pathan Tuesday called upon concerned authority to solve the problems of jute and the textile mills workers through amicable discussions.

In a statement in Chittagong they said, no harassment to and retrenchment of workers could solve the problems of jute and textile mills workers. The problems of the workers should be solved through discussion, they added.

The jute and textile mills workers allover the country have resorted to work stoppage and blockade of roads in support of their various demands including payhike and retrenchment.

JCD processions

Meanwhile, different units of Jatiyatobadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) jointly brought out a procession in the city here today demanding arrest and punishment to the killers of two JCD activists on Sunday last.

The procession passed through different roads with banner of JCD. The processionists raised various slogans including immediate identification and arrest of the killers. They also resented police inactivity during the incident.

Malaria claims 20 lives

Malaria has claimed 20 lives in last five days in villages Taidong, Tabalchhari and Boral under Matiranga upazila in Khagrachhari.

According to informed sources, with this during the last two months the death toll rose to 80 in the upazila creating panic among the people.

More than a hundred patients are being treated in the upazila health complex. But due to scarcity of necessary medicines the treatment is being hampered greatly.

Diarrhoea is also spreading in the upazila in an alarming proportion. A large number of people have been attacked by the disease. It is alleged that scarcity of oral saline and emergency medicines have been prevailing in the upazila.
