Facilities absent in Dinajpur Hospital

From Our Correspondent

DINAJPUR, Oct 30: The General Hospital for 40 lakh people of Panchagarh, Thakurgaon and Dinajpur in now facing many problems, like shortage of medicines, inadequate number of doctors, nurses, beds, ambulance and absence of blood bank.

There are only 100 beds in the hospital which are inadequate to meet the increasing needs. There is no separate ward for septic treatment. The wardboy and sweepers have to work in the residences of the doctors, it is alleged. The hospital have got four

ambulances, of which three are totally out of order and the remaining one is also in a bad condition. Moreover, there is an emergency department in this hospital which needs at least three doctors on emergency basis to meet basic requirements.

Though it was declared a modernised hospital in 1980 and named General Hospital in 1988, it has no blood bank.

 Besides, the indoor section is run with only one medical consultant and two medical of-

ficers. But the number of patients come here every day is not below one thousand. One more medical officer and two clinical assistants are badly needed in this section. As there is no boundary

wall, the hospital has turned into a grazing field for the an-
