BARISHAL, Nov 1: TB patients are on the increase in southern region of the country. According to the informed sources, unawareness of TB is the main cause for rapid spread of this disease.

According to a survey report 40 per cent patients have been attacked with this disease through regular association with TB patients and the rest 60 per cent are for smoking and other reasons.

Dr. Siddigur Rahman, Medical Officer, Barisal TB Clinic told this correspondent that there are more than 50 lakh TB patients in the country while about 80,000 of the die

About 30 to 35 TB patients are being treated in Barisal TB clinic everyday. The maximum patients come from Amanatganj, Kaunia, Bhatikhana, Hatkhola and other nearby char arcas.

A clinic source said that the disease is spreading through affected person's cough and
