

80 more tribal refugees back home

CHITTAGONG, Nov 2' : Eighty tribal refugees have returned at Rangamati and Khagrachari districts from refugee camps in Mizoram and Tripura states of India over the last two days.

With this, the total number of returnees, after government declaration of general amnesty, stood at 290.

Twenty tribal refugees returned in Rangamati from the Kabodiakhali camp under Mizoram. They were forced to leave the country by the outlawed Shantibahini activists one and a half years back.

Ranjan Chakma, Nishi Kumar Chakma and Nali Chakma, the heads of three

returnee families told UNB that they were forced to engage in subversive activities by the insurgents.

After declaration of amnesty they fled the camp escaping surveillance of tribal insurgents and Indian security force and surrendered to the law enforcing agencies in Rangamati.

The rest 60 tribals who returned at Khagrachari Thursday are being rehabilitated, said Samiran Dewan, Chairman of Local Government Parishad. Classes of Swedish

11 eat poisonous potka': hospitalised

Eleven persons including five of the same family and three other children were admitted Saturday to Sir Salimullah Medical College Hospital after consuming poisonous 'potka' fish.

Known in English as globe or balloon fish, its consumption can cause serious poisoning since it contains nerve toxin known as "tettrodetoxin".

The poisoning incident took place at Keranigonj in the village of Digirpar, Suvaddha
