PROGAS

In the letter, they said that the teachers, their families and the students are hostages now at the hands of some terrorists. The armed group damaged and set eight vehicle of the teachers ablaze on October 19 but no legal actions have so far been taken, they added.

The US Ambassador in Bangladesh, William B Milam, called on the Planning Minister, Zahiruddin Khan, at his office in Dhaka Tuesday, according to an official source, reports BSS.

200 tribal refugees back home

CHITTAGONG, Nov 5: A total of 200 tribals returned to Pancharaj upazila in Khagrachari district from Thakumbari refugee camp of south Tripura, India on Monday.

Pancharaj upazila Chairman Bokul Chandra Chakma told UNB that the tribal refugees were received at the reception camp and later sent to their respective upazilas.

He said that everyday 60 to 70 refugees are coming back to Pancharaj since the general amnesty was declared on October 23.

Meanwhile, Khagrachari local government council have

formed refugee reception committee to look after the tribals returning from India.

Each returning refugee will get 1500 taka in cash. The authorities have also arranged to allocate 21 kgs of rice to each family per week.

4 more die of diarrhoea in Rangamati

Four more people, including a teen-aged girl, died of diarrhoea Monday in Baghai upazila of the district, raising the death toll to 39 in last four days.

Monday's victims were Nilmoni Chakma (35) and Kina

Kumar Chakma (23) of west Hilar Char in Sajek Union, Krishna Chakma (13), a student of Pablaikhali High School, and Nilmoni Chakma (25) of village north Pablaikhali.

Three of the 35 others, who died between Friday and Sunday, were identified as Laxmi Kumar Chakma (35) of village Khedarmara of Pablaikhali union, Nilbaran Chakma (38) and Judharam Chakma of village Nilbaronia of Sajek union.

The Civil Surgeon confirmed the deaths and said medical teams with necessary medicines had been sent to the affected areas.

Family Planning officials leave for Jakarta today

A high-level six-member official delegation headed by Abdul Muhith Chowdhury, Joint Secretary, Ministry of Family Welfare leaves Dhaka today (Wednesday) for Jakarta for observation of Indonesian family planning programmes.

Official sources said they will see for themselves the unique family planning model set by Indonesia and further consolidate existing cooperation between the two countries in the field of population control. "Indonesia has attained tremendous success in family planning," the sources pointed out.

The team will stay there till November 16.

Earlier on Tuesday, a team of 24 Bangladesh family planning officials left Dhaka for Indonesia to receive training and orientation in population control under the Technical Cooperation among Developing Countries (TCDC) programme.

So far over 600 Bangladeshi officials received Indonesian know-how in family planning.

More IDB aid for cyclone-hit schools, colleges assured
