They were identified as Ishaque Mian (50), his daughter Jahanara (10) and son Abu Bakr (8), Rafiq (35), Momtaz Mian (25) and Shahabuddin

BELGRADE, Nov 15 : The Serbian-dominated sederal Yugoslav Parliament sacked Prime Minister Ante Markovic and Foreign Minister Budimir Loncar, both Croats, today, Tanjug news agency said, reports AFP.

# Sharia court declares Pak laws un-Islamic

ISLAMABAD, Nov 15 : The Pakistan government hurriedly announced today it was considering filing an appeal with the Supreme Court after the country's top Islamic court declared as un-Islamic the country's fiscal laws, reports

A set of 22 laws governing a wide range of interest-based activities including banking, insurance and savings were declared "repugnant" to Islam by the country's Federal Shariah Court (FSC).

The court, in its verdict here Thursday, gave the government less than eight through suitable amendments.

months to Islamise the laws If the relevant provisions

are not changed by June 30 and brought in conformity with Islam the laws will become invalid, the court ruled.

in a statement, Finance Minister Sartaj Aziz said the government "may seek the Supreme Court's ruling over practical options which fulfil the injunctions of the Holy Quran and Sunnah (Prophet's teachings) and at the same time meet the requirements of the modern economy.

"We respect the Federal Shariah Court's judgement," the minister had said before adding that the government, after studying details of the 300-page FSC verdiet, might stiff exercise its constitutional right of appeal.

If necessary the government might ask for more time to evolve practical options, he said, saying the government had already taken a number of steps to bring the banking system in line with Islamic provisions.

The FSC, set up under the country's 1973 Constitution, gave the verdict after prolonged hearings on 119 petitions filed by citizens.

The court ruled that bank interest falls within the ambit of 'riba' (the Arabic term for interest), which is strictly prohibited in all its forms in Islam, irrespective of whether the loans are for productive or consumption purposes. Reuter adds : Pakistan's

Election Commission has rejected opposition claims there was massive rigging in last year's national elections.

A three-volume report says the polls, which dealt a humillating defeat to opposition leader Benazir Bhutto, were fair "beyond any shadow of

Bhutto's Pakistan People's Party (PPP) claims it was the victim of sophisticated rigging in the October 1990 polls and cites statistical evidence of fraud in 70 of the 217 seats in the National Assembly.


**But Chief Election Commi**ssioner Najmuddin said in his report the opposition has produced no proof of alleged incompetence, dishonesty or

bias, the official APP news agency reported.

Bhutto, whose ousting as Prime Minister in August last year led to the elections claims the results were manipulated by a special election cell, a claim rejected by Najmuddin.

The commissioner, who has previously threatened to take the opposition to court for allegedly using forged documents to back its allegations, said claims of rigging without evidence were mere political propaganda.

He made a number of recommendations for changing the electoral system to prevent abuse and curtail the amount candidates could spend.
