

Shower likely

Met office forecast Sunday that rain or thundershower is likely at one or two places over Dhaka and Khulna divisions and the region of Rangpur, Comilla and Sylhet during the next 36 hours commencing 6 pm Sunday.

Weather would remain mainly dry elsewhere over the country during the period.

Inaugurating the seminar at he BIDS auditorium, Planning Minister AM Zahiruddin Khan pointed out that an enduring foundation for the national economy could be secured only through increasing the income of the rural people.

He said the major thrust of the government was on strengthening the rural economy with a view to sustaining the development process. The challenge for the nation is how soon we can reach development programmes to rural areas, he added.

The Planning Minister said that although the return on inyestment in a agriculture was faster, it never received adequate attention from the planners. He said the government would encourage agro-based industries in the country.

Presenting a paper on "the anatomy of 'Mora Kartik' : an enquiry into the economic health of the countryside", Hossain Zillur Rahman pointed out that the seasonal deficit in agricultural output during the October/Kartik period was normal phenomenon and perennial feature in the coun-

try's rural areas. However, the deficit has been accentuated this year by shortfall in the normal aman production due to floods, excess rain and draughts in some parts of the country, he added. The boro crop was also hampered in some areas, he said.

Nearly 43 per cent of the upazilas in greater Rangpur, 36 per cent in Dinajpur and 33 per cent in Pabna district may have shortfall in production, he said.

For the northern region as a whole 28 per cent of the upazilas in the Rajshahi division expect a shortfall, he added.

Incidences of moderate distress - one meal a day for 1 to 3 days in a week - and extreme distress - one meal a day for 4 to 7 days in a week during the period of October has also increased compared to last year.

Households in moderate distress increased to 18 per cent this year while those in extreme distress increased to 9 per cent compared to 8 and 4 per cent respectively last year, he pointed out. The phenomenon of extreme distress is almost wholly confined to the Rajshahi division region of Rangpur, Dinájpur and Pabna.

The households in extreme distress stood at 29 per cent this October compared to only 13 per cent during the corresponding period last year, he

While presenting his paper on "the state of industrial production and trade: an attempt to identify 'crisis' and their causes".
