Dr Khshetra Gupta of the Bengali Department of Rabindrabharati University, Calcutta, Tucsday termed poet Nazrul as an historical personality whose poetic depth should be pereeived through intellect, re-

He was delivering the second of the Nazrul Birth Centenary Lectures at the National Muscum auditorium in Dhaka. The lectures are organised by the Nazrul Institute which is celebrating the birth centenary-decade of the great

Dr Gupta discussing the study of Nazrul's poetic works both in Bangladesh and West Bengal said Nazrul was being seen more as a rebel poet than a great literary figure in West Bengal. This evaluation of the poet highlighted only a partial identity rather than his poetic totality, he observed.

Dr Gupta, a Bangladeshborn Indian researcher, said it is an historical truth that in the era of Rabindranath the rebel spirit of Kazi Nazrul helped awaken the Bangalees.

Dr Gupta analysed two poems of Kazi Nazrul - Bidrohi and Daridrya - to evaluate his personality and poetic excel-

In the poem Daridrya, Dr Gupta said, the poet had felt the expanse of poverty world-

wide from the experience of his personal poverty. Nazrul understood well that the curse of poverty was the destroyer of all happiness, beauty and prosperity, he said.

On the use of words by Nazrul, Dr Gupta said, he chose words, of both the soft and hard nature, demonstrating his inner conflict, he said.

Presided over by Prof Wakil Ahmed, Pro-Vice Chancellor of the Dhaka University, the function was also addressed by Prof Maniruzzaman, Executive Director of Nazrul Institute.

Dr Gupta was born in 1930 in Pirojpur, Barisal and did his M A in Bengali Literature from the Calcutta University.




