### Compulsory primary education soon

President Abdur Rahman Biswas Saturday underscored the need for both formal and non-formal education programmes for removing poverty and underdevelopment, reports UNB.

Speaking as chief guest at the 16th founding anniversary of Bangladesh Literacy Society (BLS) at the Institute of Engineers in Dhaka Saturday afternoon, the President also pointed out that non-formal education is essential for promoting literacy rate.

He said the present democratic government will soon make primary education compulsory as part of ensuring five basic needs for the people. In this context, he said mass education has been neglected during the previous govern-

Terming illiteracy as one of the main problems, President Biswas said mass literacy is one of the pre-requisites of education expansion and economic emancipation. Every conscious citizen, he said, should cooperate in the national efforts to remove illiter-

Education Minister Barrister Jamiruddin Sircar, who was special guest at the function, said illiteracy is the root cause of problems like population boom, food shortage and lack of housing and shelter.

He stressed the need for neofi-formal education for illiterate elderly people and said that a non-formal education centre should be set up in every union to eradicate illiter-

He informed that the government will launch a compulsory free primary schooling programme from next January.

Chief patron of BLS and deputy leader of Parliament Dr AQM Badruddoza Chowdhury speaking on the occasion said late President Zia had visualised a peaceful revolution to eradicate illiteracy.

He said only 4 lakh committed social workers can eradicate illiteracy from the country within a period of five years. He also emphasised the use of mass media and NGOs in the campaign for mass education.

The function was also addressed by President of BLS Khondoker Dr Bazlul Haq, General Secretary Prof Osman Gani, resident representative of UNICEF Cole P Dodge and Winston Temple of UNDP. Chairman of University Grants Commission Prof Shams-ul Haq gave the vote of thanks.
