

BANDARIAN, Nov 27: Local administration today awarded four tribal young men for their spontaneous role against Shantibahini outlaws, nine of them lynched recently, reports UNB.

The youths, belonging to the Marma tribe, trapped nine Shantibahini gunmen who were then lynched by villagers on November 21 at village Madhu in Thana upazila of the district.

The insurgents came out of the hill jungles and begged food to the young men. They kept the gunmen in waiting in the name of preparing food but informed the villagers and unitedly swooped on them.

Among the recovered arms were one revolver and 111 rounds of bullet, one 93-rifle, one 303 rifle and 69 rounds of their ammunition, one sub-machine carbine (SMC) along with 34 bullets and one hand-grenade.

The young men were awarded in cash by MP Bir Bahadur and local army Brigade Commander Brig Shakhawat Hossain. The Deputy Commissioner and the Superintendent of Police attended the function.

More than 2,000 people have been killed by the Shantibahini men in the Chittagong Hill Tracts, which also comprises Khagrachhari and Rangamati hill districts, over the last 10 years.

CHITTAGONG, Nov 27: Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia today underlined the paramount need for united efforts of all professional groups for furthering the nation on the road to progress and prosperity, reports BSS.

She said, "We have to work with sincerity and dedication from our respective position to make the present democratic government successful by implementing its various development programmes."

The Prime Minister was addressing the fifth reunion darbar of East Bengal Regiment at Chittagong Cantonment.

Begum Zia said the East Bengal Regiment had created a golden chapter in the history of the nation. The regiment was the first among those who took arms during the war of independence,

fought along with the people and brought freedom for the nation.

The Prime Minister said the armed forces of the country was the symbol of our freedom and sovereignty.

The Prime Minister said Shaheed President Ziaur Rahman was the first to realise the need of skilled and modern armed forces for protecting the country's independence.

Begum Zia said President Zia raised the East Bengal Regiment from five brigades to five divisions.

Begum Zia said the armed forces had also played a due role during the last elections and helped in holding a free and fair polls and establishing democracy.

The Prime Minister said she was aware of the problems of the regiment and those

would be solved in phases. She said "We must realise that as we have resource constraint all of our problems can not be solved at a time."

A delegation of Bangladesh Civil Service (BCS) Ansar Association Wednesday met the Home Minister Abdul Matin Chowdhury and submitted a memorandum seeking early solution of various anomalies in the service.

Some of the demands, put forward by the Association, include reorganisation of the Ansar cadre in consistent with other cadre services, abolition of the system of encadering the army personnel and fulfilment of higher posts by cadre officers instead of army officers.
