
Arch rivals chase title

morning. None should expect either of the arch-rivals to give any quarters in today's game which will be broadcast live by Radio Bangladesh. BTV will also telecast the record highlights of the day's play in the evening.

Defending champions Mohammedan Sporting, who have the enviable distinction of having featured in every final of the tournament since its inception way back in 1979-80, will be facing an opponent who themselves have reached the final on seven previous occasions. While Mohammedans have won the title seven times -- the last three seasons in a row Abahani have won it four times. Bangladesh Biman are the only other side to have written their name on the honour roll by having won the trophy in the inaugural year. Although Mohammedans

have a better track record in the limited overs tourney which is organised by the Bangladesh Cricket Control Board (BCCB) as a curtain raiser for the local league programme, Abahani enjoy a slight psychological advantage from the fact that on the seven occasions they have met their traditional rivals in the final they have won the issue on four occasions to thrice for Mohammedans.

Mohammedans' road to this year's final saw them winning against Surjo Tarun Club, Udity Club, Bangladesh Biman in the quarter-final and last year's runners-up Greater Mymensingh Cricket Club (GMCC) whom they thrashed by eight wickets in last Monday's semifinal.

On the other hand, Abahani reached the final beating last year's Second Division runners-up Ajax sports Club, last year's semifinalists Dhaka Wanderers Club, Bangladesh Biman in the Group D final, Udity Club in the quarter-final and Gulshan Youth Club in last Tuesday's semifinal.



The Abahani attack is spearheaded by left-arm paceman G M Nowsher Prince. Another left-armer Anis, who joined from Mohammedans, Morshed, De-Silva, and Lamba himself are also quite competent one day bowlers. Then there is spinner Effi and Masoom.

Mohammedans also have a formidable batting line up. Their new recruits from Biman Jahangir Alam and Aminul Islam Bulbul are wonderful players with Jahangir already showing signs of repeating his last year's performance by having hit a century. Bulbul can tear any attack apart.

On top of these two there is the skipper Minhazul Abedin Nannoo who is considered by many to be the best bat in the country. He, too, has been in good nick with the willow. Rumesh Kaluwirthana, their Sri Lankan wieket-keeper batsmen who some seasons ago played for Brothers, is also a solid player, as is Rafigul Alam who led a weak Abahani last season. On his day there are very few in this country who can bat better than this enigmatic all-rounder.

Mohammedans seem to be slightly better endowed with several bits-and-pieces allrounders in the persons of Golam Faruq Suru, Jahangir Alam Dulu (ex-Biman) and their Sri Lankan opening bowler Gamagee lex-Wari Club).

The second R V six-a-side cricket tournament organised by the Dhaka Cricket Players' Association (DCPA) will begin tomorrow simultaneously at the Dhaka Stadium and Dhanmondi Cricket Stadium.

A press conference was held in this connection yesterday at Dhaka Stadium conference room.

Seventeen teams will be taking part, divided into four

The top teams in the each of the groups will play for the R V Cup while the bottom two teams of each group will play for the R V Plate.

All the Cup and Plate matches will be played on a knock-out basis.

Matches will be played between two teams of six players each consisting of a maximum of five stx ball overs to be Club. bowled by each side.

The three-day tourney will

start at 8.30 am daily and only old balls will be used. There will be no lunch break and matches may even be played at night under floodlights if required.

tralia, Nov 28 Australian captain Allan Border is widely expected to celebrate his

record-breaking 126th Test match with victory over India in the first game of their fivetest series which starts at the Woolloon Gabba Oval on Friday, reports Reuter.

India have suffered one of the briefest - and poorest Text build-ups in recent memory and will need to produce a dramatic change of form if they are to gain a first ever Test victory in Brisbane.

Their batsmen, having delayed their departure from India to host South Africa's historic visit, have struggled to adapt to Australian wickets. They were dismissed for 64 western Australia.

Their bowlers were unfavourably compared with a grade attack after being hit for a century by a Country XI batsman.

The preparation problems began the moment they arrived when inspirational batsman and captain Mohammad Azharuddin strained a groin lifting his cases at Perth

No such worries for his counterpart Border, who typifled the impressive carly-season from of Australia's batsmen with 196 in his opening innings, ending a two-year spell without a first-class century.

Border, who averages 32.30 with the bat in Tests and has not missed one since 1979. could push the record past 150 as he wants to go on at least until Australia's tour of England in 1993. Suni Gavaskar, whose 125-

A tough job for Smith

BRISBANE, Nov 28: Mike Smith, the former England Test captain, steps into the front line of cricket's fight to clean up its image on Friday, reports Reuter.

Increasing player indiscipline has led the game's ruling body, the International Cricket Council, to institute a system of match referees to oversee conduct.

Smith becomes the first to take up that role when he ad judicates the opening Test be tween Australia and India a the Gabba.

He will have the power to fine players up to 2,800 dollars (2,200 US) and suspend them for three Tests.

"Hopefully I will be able to just sit there and enjoy the match," said Smith.

The referee is there to back up the umpires and is not concentrated with their decisions. He is not a third umpire but is there to ensure the spirit of the game is observed and the conduct of the game maintained." Referees will have access

to television and video monttors and must decide punishments within 24 hours if an incident.


