Tk 122 cr soon to develop edn sector

Education Minister Jamiruddin Sircar Friday called upon the Engineers and Architects to utilise in their talent and expertise in building an improved infrastructure of the educational institutions, reports BSS.

The Education Minister was speaking at the national conference and the 5th council of Diploma Engineers Association of the Facilities Department at Shikha Bhaban in Dhaka Friday morning.

Presided over by President of the Association M Matjur Rahman, the conference was addressed by Education Secretary Mir Mustafizur Rahman, Director, Facilities Department S M A Mannan, President of Institute of Diploma Engineers Shafuluddin Sircar and General Secretary of the Association Mia Sultan Ahmed.

The Education Minister who was the chief guest said the present government would

undertake an extensive programme for developing educational institutions throughout the country. He said a total of Taka 122 crore was being sanctioned for the implementation of six projects under Facilities Department.

Sircar asserted that the engineers of Facilities Department must work with missionary zeal and devotion to construct better infrastructure of educational institutions for the implementation of universal primary education programme and development of education.

Barrister Sircar said the present government was determined to eradicate illiteracy from the country by the year 2000. He added that the government had already promoted 709 lecturers to Assistant Professors and it would take steps towards promoting the engineers of Facilities Department to encourage them in their works.

Pottery with a difference

Sabrina Murshid and Shathi Chowdhury had an exhibition of pottery and terra cotta lamps, sculpture pieces and paintings at 765 Satmasjid Road, on Thursday.

The paintings included an interesting collection of works of young and established artists. This included "Memorial" a graphic print by Kibria. There was Jamal Ahmed's "Boat at Sea with Birds", and which an overpowering tranquillising and mystifying effect.

The pottery and ceramic work included imitation antique Indian god images, and jugs with elephant and pig faces. Some of the patterns had been taken from available museum catalogues.

The price of the jugs ranged from Tk 800 to Tk 2000. Terra cotta and glazed lamps of fascinating shapes were for sale from Tk 500 to Tk 1800. Meanwhile, the paintings ranged from Tk 1000 to Tk 35,000.



There was Rokeya Sultana's etching of romantic doll like figures, evoking childhood and innocence. Rafiqun Nabi's "Bird in a Cage" was fascinating woodcut in silver, green and gold. Abdul Baset's "Composition", "Mother and Child" and "Old Lady" were oil on canvas creations.

To add flavour to the collection there was oriental painting by Camelia Perween, showing women going to the market and making garlands of flowers.

Mukul Mukusuddin's metal creations in brass and steel were interesting too. So was Rezauzzaman Reza's mixed media creation. The wooden sculptures by Nazrul Islam and Jehanara Perveen were also worth seeing. The murals in terra cotta by Shameem Ahmed and Konel added interest to the show.

Cement statues by Bulbul Ahmed and Shipile, that were present there were also laudable.

No-confidence on UP chairman moved

RANGAMATI, Dec 6 : Members of the Mainimukh Union Parishad of Langadu upazila of the district have expressed no-confidence on the Chairman and demanded his immediate dismissal, reports UNB.

They alleged misappropriation of fund and misuse of government property by the Chairman Kamal Uddin.

Out of nine, 8 members of the Parishad have brought 19 points allegations against him and submitted a memorandum to the Deputy Commissioner on November 25 in this regard.

The allegations included misappropriation of Government grant, Union Parishad properties, project money and food grants.

Deputy Commissioner of the hill district said, he instructed the concerned authorities to investigate the allegations after visiting the Parishad office.

He also ordered Kamal

Uddin to refund the money, which has not yet been complied.

Meanwhile, people of Langadu upazila in a meeting chaired by ex-UP Chairman Shah Alam appealed to the Government to hold union parishad election here like all other union parishad across the country which is scheduled to be held in January next.

It may be mentioned that no election in 7 union parishads of the said upazila will be held like all other upazila of the country as announced by the Election Commissioner.

Qul Khwani of late Ali Amjad Khan, who died on Thursday, (briefly reported yesterday) will be held today (Saturday) at his residence at 25, Green Road after Maghreb prayers at 5:30 pm. Relatives, friends and admirers have been requested to attend the qul and offer fateha for the departed soul.

Ali Amjad Khan, Advocate, Supreme Court of Bangladesh, ex-MNA of erstwhile Pakistan National Assembly and a renowned politician breathed his last on Thursday at a local clinic. He was 86.

Khan, who comes of a respectable family of Brahmanbaria was educated at Dhaka University, practiced law first in Calcutta and then in Dhaka. He was actively involved in politics and was a close associate of Hossain Shahid Suhrawardy and Maulana Bhashani. He was one of the founders of Awami League and was one of the Vice Presidents of the organisation.

Khan was elected member of National Assembly of Pakistan in 1964. He represented the country in the United Nations.

His eldest son Iqbal Ansari Khan is a lawyer of Supreme Court and past District governor of R.I. Dist. 3280.

Khan was buried on Thursday at the premises of the mosque adjacent to his house after Zohr prayers according to his last wishes.
